Gray and M'Adoo Friends

When McAdoo was director-general of the railroads, President Gray was at the head of the railroad administration board, and during those strenuous days the two men struck up a warm friendship that has grown even stronger with the passing days. This fact, connected with other facts that are coming to light, give a basis for the rumor that McAdoo, if he realizes he can not make it, would go the limit to defeat Smith, and that he would prefer an upstanding, able executive of big business calibre like Carl Gray, to a Tammany wile like Al Smith.

Bosses Fear Bryan.

Tammany, Taggart, Brennan and others are vastly more interested in local matters than in national, and that fact is pretty generally known. Hence the fear on the part of the ultra-progressive democrats that if they cannot win for Smith they will "lay down" and let the nomination go by default.
