Mrs. Russell Fowles, North Platte, 1923 Nebraska golf champion, came through with flying colors in the first round of play in the championship flight of the state tourney, by defeating Mrs. Karl Linsinger, Happy Hollow club, 6 and 4.

On the short five Mrs. Linsinger drove the 135 yards to the green, while Mrs. Fowles drove into a bad lie on the bank. Mrs. Fowles exhibited the reason why she is a champion by "ironing" out of the difficult position onto the green. Both holed out in four. Mrs. Linsinger was still one down.
