Chicago Wheat Follows Corn Up, Then Drops Back

Quick Recovery Effected at Bell, However -- Local **Buying of Grains** Is Feature.

Chicago, June 27.—Wheat trailed corn upward most of the session today and then reacted in response to rainfall over the Canadian northwest. This surprised corn, which up to that time had been riding on a wave of bullish enthusiasm into new high ground. Longs suddenly became panic-stricken and rushed madly to unload. Prices for the yellow cereal broke badly, dropping 6½c. At the bell, however, a quick recovery was effected.
Wheat closed 1½ @1½c lower, corn was ½ @2½c lower, oats were ½ @½c down and rye ruled 1½ @2½c higher.
Local buying of grains was the feature today. Aggressive support from influential interests and the outside was less in evidence. Eastern houses sold wheat early, and cash interests were credited with selling around best levels. Winnipeg also dropped because of rains over Canada, and closed relatively weak compared with Chicago.

Corn experienced little trouble in moving higher during the early session. But with the setback in wheat it presently was discovered that cash demand for corn was less active, that weather over the belt was improved and that the country was selling some to arrive. Cash corn prices at the last were le higher to 1c lower.
