

Democrats Turn Down Minority Plank on League

Newton D. Baker Collapses on Platform After Vain Plea for Ideals of Woodrow Wilson.

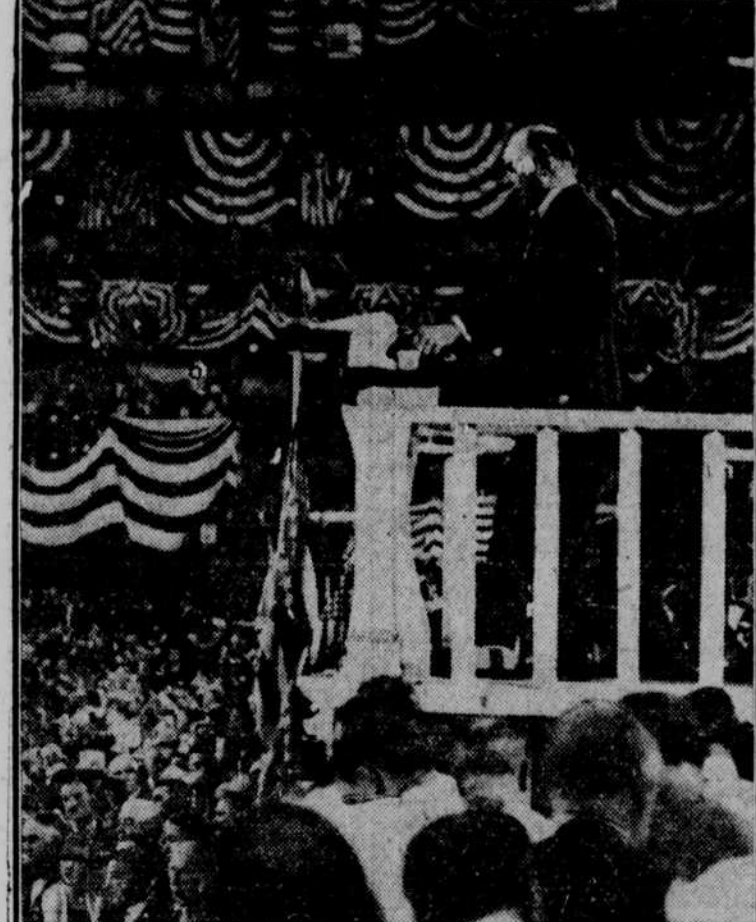
Earlier in the session the Georgia group had been the target for a long and bitter demonstration against the plank, after one of the dissenters, among them Andrew C. Standish of Athens, had taken the speaker's stand and pleaded with the convention to take an open stand against the invisible empire.

It, the final moments before the result was announced, Joseph P. Tully, secretary to Woodrow Wilson, while he was in the White House, led a determined campaign on the convention floor to swing over the few votes that would write the anti-klan plank into the party platform.

The drive of the anti-klan cohorts did not even after the vote had been announced, the adjournment found Quigley on his feet seeking amid the confusion to challenge the ballot of the entire convention.

"The only difference between these two reports is that one provides for carrying this question to the American people, and the other provides we shall again plunge this question into the political contest of this year, couched with 50 other questions," Lucking said.

"The curse of the whole league of nations problem is that it was plunged into politics.
'In all that great struggle in the senate and in the press over the league, President Wilson frequently declared: 'We will take a solemn referendum on this question. That is precisely what we are proposing to do.'"

Lucking was followed by Senator A. A. Jones of New Mexico, who described in detail the labor of the committees through four weary days and nights, how they fought and struggled for unanimous agreement and finally were presented in referendum to the people.

Baker took the platform when Jones finished at 6:40 p. m. The former secretary of war looked tired, but there was the light of battle in his eyes. He spoke for his own plank.

Baker's speech was a monumental effort. Tired to the point of exhaustion, his emotion got the better of him several times and he literally threw himself across the speaker's table, behind which he was standing.
