Then Ex-Senator Gilbert M. Hitchcock of Nebraska proposed that beginning with the seventy-fifth ballot, the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes should voluntarily retire for the day until only five were left and a choice would perhaps be possible with the field thus restrict-

The McAdoo forces favored it, as they had favored Semans' earlier effort, but on roll call they could muster only 496 votes for it, as against 4891/2 opposed.

Next came Judge T. H. Ball of Texas, with a proposition arranging as did the others for the progressive elimination of the lowest until the field narrowed down to three men. But there was a kick in the end. It provided that if, after five ballots, none of this trio was able to emerge with two-thirds, then the unit rule would be abandoned

This proposition so scared the Mc-Adoo managers they passed the word to "kill it." And it was accomplished with neatness and dispatch.


