Great Britain Triumphs Over United States in Olympic Sprint Event

Liddell Wins 400-Meter Dash in Record Time

J. C. Taylor, Former Princeton Star, Makes Poor Showing, Finishing Fifth -Chicagoan Second.

By DAVIS J. WALSH. Great Britain handed America an other bitter disappointment this afternoon in the Olympic stadium when E. H. Liddell won the 400-meter dash in a new world record time of :47 3-5. It was the third time in two days the record was smashed.

H. Fitch of the Chicago Athletic association was second; G. M. Butler of England, third; Johnston of Canada fourth, and J. Coard Taylor, former Princetonian, fifth.

America was confident of winning the event after Fitch set a new orld's record of 47 4-5 seconds in the first semi-final heat this morning. Liddell won the second semi-final heat but took 48 1.5 seconds to cover the distance and few expected him to furnish sturdy opposition to the
