DUTCH TO STAGE
1928 OLYMPICS

New York, July 11.—The Netherlands Chamber of Commerce here today said that according to 'reliable authorities' in Holland there was no truth to reports that the 1928 Olympics games, which have been assigned to Amsterdam would go elsewhere because of financial difficulties in the Netherlands.

"Amsterdam is prepared to go through with the games," the chamber's statement said. "She has a fine stadium and full facilities for caring for the athletes and the spectators."

It has been reported that Holland would relinquish its claim to the games, and they would therefore go to Los Angeles, which was second choice.
