

# Bailey's Pitching Enables Buffaloes to Cop Series Final From Tulsa

## Omaha Hurler Allows Oilers but Four Hits

### Tesar Starts for Southerners but Lasts Only Three Innings—Herd Throws Innings—Batting Averages.

By RALPH WAGNER. These Omaha Buffaloes of ours found themselves again yesterday and pounded out an 8 to 1 victory over the Tulsa Oilers in the third and final game of the series. It was the only contest of the series that the Buffs copped, but they made their margin of victory a large one at the expense of two southern moundmen. OF Bill Bailey labored for the Herd and labored hard all afternoon. He had his southpaw working in fine style and turned the Oilers back with only four hits, three of them coming in the second inning when the southerners scored their one and only run. The other hit came in the sixth inning after two were out, and didn't amount to anything as it was only a single. Of the four hits Tulsa collected, one was a double off Stuart's bat in the second. Bailey had extra good control of the ball, striking out five visitors and bringing his grand total of strikeouts for the season to 112, which made him the leading strikeout pitcher of the old circuit.

The Oilers didn't get good pitching yesterday like they got the two previous afternoons when they defeated the Buffaloes. Jack Tesar started and lasted until the fourth. He was pretty liberal with his hits. The Herd fattening their batting average on eight innings of which one was a triple by Bonowitz and two doubles, one by Cullup and another by Jimmy O'Neil. The Buffaloes cashed those eight hits for six runs, which made Mister Tesar the losing pitcher of the p. m.

### Bolen Relieves Mate.

Bolen relieved his mate in the fourth and managed to wobble along to the seventh when the Buffaloes turned his curves and drops into hits and scored two runs. The last Tulsa pitcher was nicked for three hits, which made the Herd's hits for the day total 11. It is the most biggles Omaha has collected at the expense of Oiler hurlers in any one game of the series.

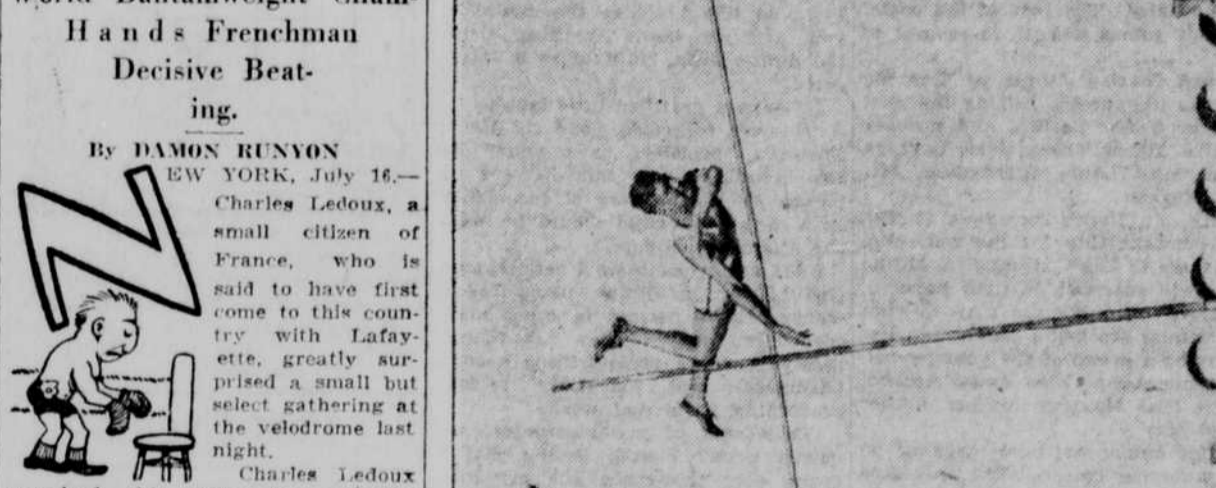
