PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 11.—Pittsburgh won a double-header from the Phillies today, 7 to 3 and 6 to 4. Manager Fletcher and umpire Pfirman came to blows in the third inning of the first game when the Philadelphia leader rushed to the plate to argue over decisions on Glenn's hurling. Umpire Hart, the peace-maker, came out of the melee with the only mark of battle, a skinned cheek.

Maranville was thrown out of the game when he argued over a called third strike in the eighth inning. Yde had little to do, his only contribution being the Fletcher men in the first game, which was marked by Carey's two homers into the bleachers.
