Lott, Norton Win Third Round Matches—Missouri Valley Champ No Match for "Little Bill."

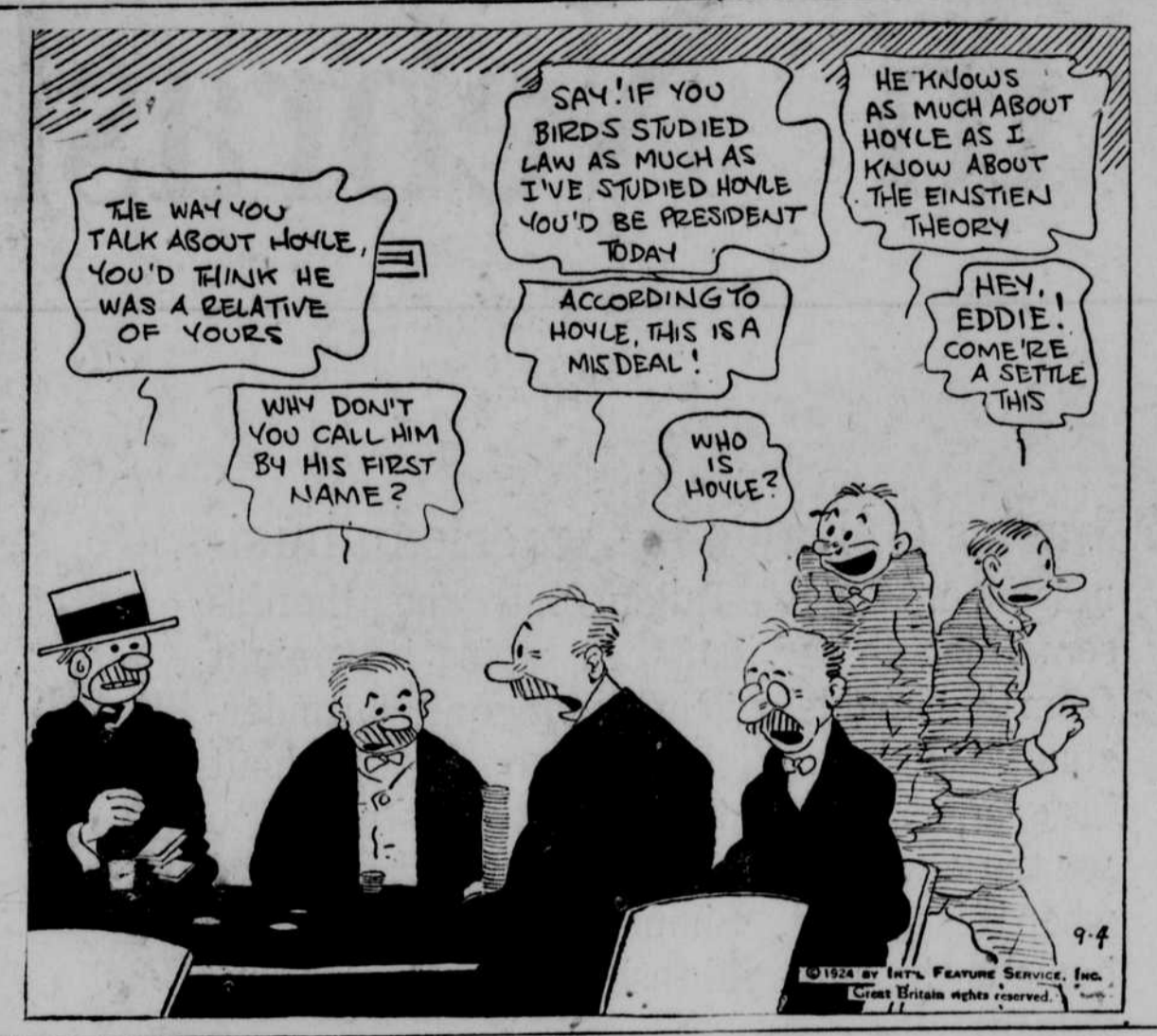

Except for a brief spell of unsteadiness in the first set, when he pulled out after trailing at 2-4, on games, Johnston put Brown to rout, his bounding forehanders quickly deciding the last two sets.

Bryan Norton of St. Louis gained his third straight victory and advanced to the fourth round when he conquered Walter Westbrook, Los Angeles star, in straight sets, Norton's victory came as it best and he quickly beat the Californian.
