

### Boy and Girl in Suicide Pact of Childhood Love and Wooded Plot Near Tragic Bridge Where Bodies Found



Here are pictures of the principals and scenes of the doubly tragical deaths of two children, caused by troubled love of two child-sweethearts near Wymore, Neb., Wednesday.

No. 1—Charles Cleary, 16, whose body was found with that of Bessie Nemic, 15, a bullet hole in each temple, near Wymore Wednesday morning.

No. 2—Bessie Nemic, left, taken in playful pose with a chum behind an automobile near her home.

No. 3—The spot in the timber in Rawlins pasture, south of Wymore, where the two bodies, clasped in each other's arms, were found. The cross (X) marks the spot.

No. 4—Indian creek bridge, near where the bodies were found at a lonely spot on Hook road just south of Wymore. It was also under this bridge that Forrest Schwenker and Betty Parks were drowned in February, 1922.

No. 5—The M. M. Nemic home, where Bessie Nemic lived in Wymore.

No. 6—The home in Wymore where Charles Cleary lived.

The young couple had been keeping company about a year. A note addressed to the boy's father was found which said:

"Goodby, Dad; bury us in the same grave. I love her very much—Charlie."
