BOSTON (N.Y.), Sept. 10.—The New York Giants gained half a game on Brooklyn here today by defeating Boston, 22 to 1, in the first game of the season.

Frisch hit six hits in succession, including a home run, but missed trying Wilbert Robinson's record of 1834 by being thrown out on a bunt in his last time up.

New York scored freely in the second game and knocked Greenwich out in the fifth. Manager Hancock of Boston returned to his lineup, the first time he has played since an operation for appendicitis forced his retirement in the early summer.
