### St. Joseph's 9-to-4 Victory Puts Buffaloes Back on Top of Standings.

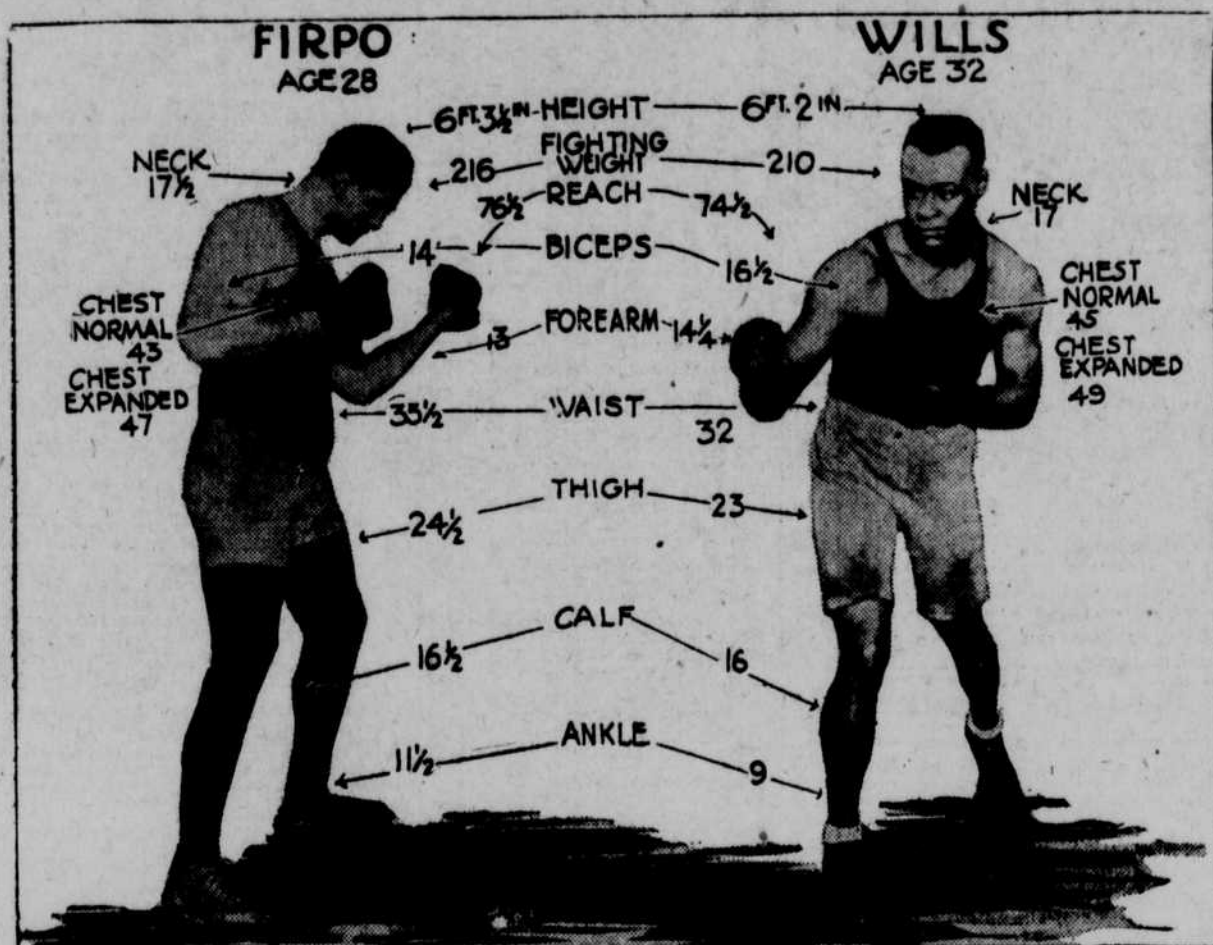

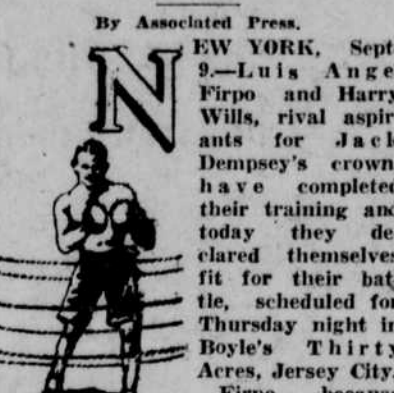

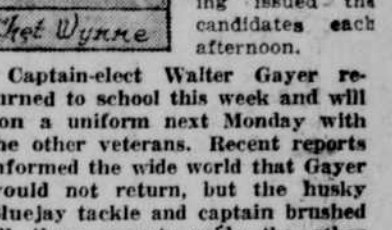
