

Means Confesses He Lied; Declares Wheeler Knew It

Senate Hearing Was "Frame-up," He Writes Daugherty; Says Other Witnesses Perjurors.

(Continued from Page One.) I see Mr. Daugherty and arrangements to this end were thought to have been perfected, but no such arrangements culminated successfully. I was advised to go ahead and get in touch with Senator Wheeler and find out what information Senator Wheeler was seeking and what was the basis of any attack Senator Wheeler was about to launch against Mr. Daugherty and the Department of Justice. I called to see Wheeler and held numerous conferences with him, both at his home and at his office, all of which I have a record of. Five films only ground for attack. The only evidence that Wheeler had of any possible wrongdoing on the part of Mr. Daugherty which he disclosed to me, were some records in regard to bringing into Washington of moving pictures of the Dempsey-Carpenter fight. Senator Wheeler had been giving more and more evidence in documents and stated to me he was going to use this as an attack on Secretary of State Hughes, President Coolidge and others who attended the exhibition of these pictures. A former agent of the Department of Justice, either directly or through some friends, had furnished Senator Wheeler with information and evidence. I reported to friends of Mr. Daugherty that this was the only evidence that Senator Wheeler had. In the meantime, Senator Wheeler, because of publicity that he was about to have or had, offered a resolution to investigate the Department of Justice, and Mr. Daugherty began to have many callers at his office, with the most sensational statements and stories as to conditions that existed at the Department of Justice. In each and every instance I explained to him that there was nothing of the sort in the statements that these visitors were giving him and showed why the statements could not be true and that they were emanating from people who had been discharged from the Department of Justice. Upon my return from Florida and after a conference with Senator Wheeler, it was agreed that I was to assist him in the investigation of the attorney general and the department of justice in the way of furnishing of evidence, examination and coaching of witnesses, etc.

Wheeler grew desperate in his efforts to find some information on which he could base charges against the administration and against the Department of Justice. He had certain plans in view that made it imperative that he make good in connection with his public statements as to the conditions in the Department of Justice and that the Department of Justice be connected with the alleged scandals. These plans, which were going on in the effort was being made to frame Mr. Daugherty, were reported to Col. Thomas Miller, the alien property custodian, an official and personal friend of Mr. Daugherty, with the request that he give this information to Mr. Daugherty. Col. Miller reported that Mr. Daugherty said that it would be impossible for anybody to successfully frame him, and that he "did not give a damn" about what was going on in Senator Wheeler's office. However, Colonel Miller, understanding more of the details of what was going on, questioned that the information which I had given him was being reported to him, which I did, from day to day. In the meantime, Senator Wheeler had secured some of the copies of the letters that Jess Smith had written to Roxie Simson, and with these letters in a way that he never intended on the part of Jess Smith, and interpreted in a different way. All such letters were used as a basis for the frame-up, Wheeler taking the position that he was forced to connect Jess Smith and Howard Manington and others directly with Mr. Daugherty. In any manner would prove discreditable to them. I have all this documentary evidence, which will throw an entirely different light on the Wheeler investigation. This documentary evidence is absolutely irrefutable.

Up until the time I took the stand in the investigation I heretofore that I should seek information as to what Senator Wheeler was going to do and on the day before I took the stand received information that Mr. Daugherty said I could "go to hell" so far as he was concerned. Except for this message I would not have taken the stand the day I did, but would have stayed in that situation alone. I can and will review my testimony, pointing out statement for statement that I made for Senator Wheeler at his suggestion, that I knew not to be true, but in order that it would complete Senator Wheeler's chain of circumstantial evidence, which I know that I can show by physical evidence that my statements could not be true, at the time I called Senator Wheeler's attention to the fact that it was probable that these statements could not be true. In other words, I was at some other place and the records will so show, entirely different from where I alleged to have been at the time. The only reason I made the statements the way I did was because of the message received from Mr.

Army Airplane Demolished in Crash, but Fliers Escape Without Scratch

Although their airplane was completely demolished when it crashed two miles west of the Fort Crook landing field Saturday afternoon, Samuel Taylor Moore, former army captain and now a special writer of Springfield, Mass., and Lieut. J. K. McDuffie of Mitchell field, L. I., escaped without a single injury. The two men left Mitchell field last Thursday morning, bound for the west coast, following the regular air mail route. They were forced down at Iowa City Friday by rain, wind and fog, but hopped off for Omaha Saturday morning, arriving at Fort Crook at 12:40. A short time later they hopped off to the west, expecting to reach Wyoming by night. They had scarcely gained a flying altitude—about 100 feet—when their motor stopped. Lieutenant McDuffie, sitting in the smooth place for landing, worked frantically to get the motor started. He failed, and they hit a small hay stack, trundling at about 30 miles an hour into a hay stack. The force of the collision whirled the ship completely around, breaking every strut and demolishing the wings and the fuselage. The men received not a single scratch. Moore was making the trip as a means of getting first hand information on the air mail service for newspaper and magazine articles. The plane was furnished by the army air service. It was a DeHavilland.

Lieutenant McDuffie recently headed a photographic squad which met the world fliers at Mitchell field. "It was a matter of hitting the hay stack or a fence and trees," said Lieutenant McDuffie. "I chose the hay stack, throwing my goggles away as a precaution to my eyes. A choked gasoline feed, which killed the motor, was responsible for the forced landing." The men were wired the commandant at Mitchell field, asking for another ship to continue their trip to San Francisco.

With Jarvis Offutt. Moore was in Omaha from June, 1917, to January, 1918, training in the lighter than air service at Fort Omaha. He went overseas with Jarvis Offutt, the Omaha youth who was killed when his plane crashed in England, shortly after he had crossed the Atlantic. He and Offutt crossed the Adriatic. Moore says Offutt had a strong premonition that he was to die, even during the crossing. Moore is a friend of Carl Egge, air mail superintendent here, and expressed the opinion that the moving of the service headquarters to Omaha will be of great benefit to the city.

Daugherty just before I took the stand. By quick review of the testimony before the Wheeler committee, with the documentary evidence available, it can be proved conclusively that Senator Wheeler knew that he was framing Mr. Daugherty and the republican administration and to some extent this involves the oil investigation, because Senator Wheeler was constantly in close touch with Senators Walsh and La Follette in connection with this inquiry.

Refuses to Help Walsh. While this frame-up was going on I was in conference with Senators Walsh, Wheeler, Dill and La Follette and Philip La Follette. I have in my possession a subpoena issued by Senator Dill for me to appear before the Walsh committee and to testify to evidence that they framed up, and which plan was abandoned because Senator Wheeler decided that he did not want any favorable publicity withdrawn from him in connection with the Daugherty investigation that might revert to Senator Dill and the Walsh committee. Briefly, there is available now all of the papers, documents and other material in connection with the Daugherty investigation which will absolutely offset the unfavorable record as it now stands, also in connection with these documents is a great deal of material in connection with the oil matter, including McAdoo's correspondence with Senators Walsh and Wheeler. The testimony given before the Wheeler committee by Roxie Simson, R. Momand, myself and the majority of the other witnesses is nothing but a tissue of lies put in the mouths of these witnesses by Senator Wheeler primarily to confound and discredit the department of justice and the administration.

Made False Statements. These witnesses and myself were persuaded to make these false statements by Senator Wheeler under threats of indictments and in some cases by promises of gain and aid in others. Briefly stated, the letters, correspondence and documents available will absolutely refute and confound the Wheeler-Daugherty investigation findings and throw an absolutely different light on the oil investigation where prominent democrats were urging that their names not be drawn into the matter. Senator Wheeler, talked personally to nearly every witness that appeared before the committee and gained Senator Wheeler's confidence to the extent that I read, assorted and handled most of the letters, documents, etc., that came to the committee.

He was said to be somewhere in Utah on a business trip.

IRENE CASTLE'S CHARGE IGNORED Ithaca, N. Y., Sept. 21.—Neither Capt. Robert E. Tremain nor members of the family of his father, R. H. Tremain, one of the governors of the New York Federal Reserve bank, would comment on the arrest of Captain Tremain on charges by his former wife, Mrs. Irene Castle Tremain McLaughlin, that he had refused to return \$40,000 in securities she entrusted to him at the time of their marriage. Tremain was arrested by Sheriff Green on a civil suit issued by Mrs. Tremain in a New York City office. J. J. Kun, Mrs. McLaughlin's attorney, had submitted an alleged signed receipt given by Captain Tremain and acknowledging the liability.

(Continued from Page One.) which we pay to Washington and Lincoln. They are unrivaled and unpassed. Above all else, they are American. The institutions of our country stand justified by their reason and experience. I am aware that they will continue to be assailed. But I know they will continue to stand. We may perish, but they will endure. They are founded on the Rock of Ages. The president gave particular stress to the liberties, civil, political and religious, allowed under the constitution. A proper maintenance of these, he said, made it "important to understand the foundation on which they were built and the claims by which they justify their own existence. The sovereign rights and royal state of every American citizen." "The foundation of our independence and our government," he continued, "rests upon our basic religious convictions. Back of the authority of our laws is the authority of the Supreme Judge of the world, to whom we still appeal for their final justification. Reflects Public Conscience. "The constitution and laws of our country are adopted and enacted through the direct action of the people, or through their duly chosen representatives. They reflect the enlightened conscience of our country. They ought always to speak with the true and conscientious voice of the people. Each voice has from time immemorial had the authority of divine sanction. In their great fundamentals they do not change. An enlightened conscience of our country is to become enemies to ourselves and instruments of our own destruction. That is the path towards servitude. Obedience is not for the protection of some one else, but for the protection of ourselves. It needs to be remembered that it is not the individual who is to be altered in his details, but the representation of the best that we know at any given time. To support the constitution, to observe the laws, is to be true to our own higher nature. That is the path, and the only path, towards liberty. 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
