

Cozy Dolan Will Ask Damages for Alleged Slanderous Attack by Landis

Former New York Coach to Enter Federal Court

Will Start Action for Restoration to Baseball and for Share of World's Series Receipts.

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—Cozy Dolan, New York Giant coach, who was banned from baseball with Jimmy O'Connell on charges of attempted bribery, will bring suit against Commissioner Landis for alleged slander, according to announcement today by W. J. Fallon, a noted criminal attorney, who has been engaged by Dolan to handle the case.

Fallon said Dolan will make his action a basis for an attempt to clear his name, gain restoration to baseball ranks and obtain his share of the 1924 world series money.

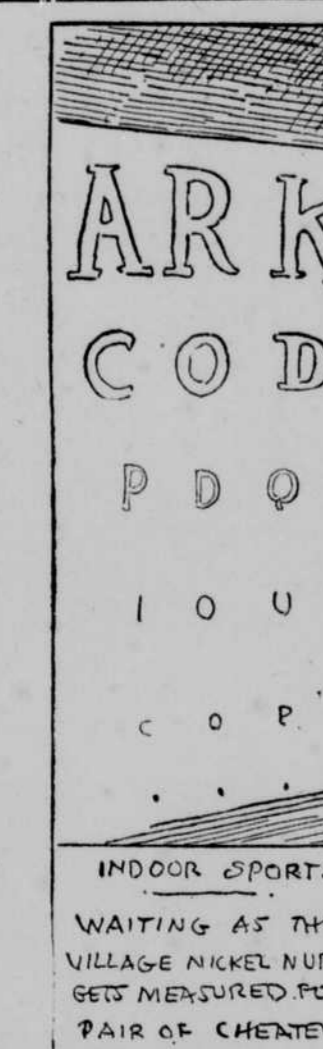
O'Connell's confession of his offer of a \$500 bribe to Henrie Sande, Philadelphia shortstop, to "throw" a game with the Giants September 27, named Dolan as instigator. Dolan denied any connection with the deal but was banished with O'Connell by Commissioner Landis because his statements were held to be vague and unconvincing.

Landis Refuses Comment on Suit

Chicago, Oct. 21.—Kenesaw Mountain Landis, baseball commissioner, refused tonight to comment on the threatened suit for slander which "Cozy" Dolan, expelled New York coach plans to bring against Landis and organized baseball. The commissioner also revealed what course he would pursue providing the suit is filed.

"It looks like a repetition in 1921" was the comment of President Johnson of the American League. "Dolan," Johnson said, has retained Attorney Fallon. "He is a lawyer who represented Arnold Rothstein after the 1919 world series scandal between the White Sox and the Cincinnati club. He also represented Abe Attell during the time in which we tried to fix the so-between in fixing the White Sox players. Fallon has been close to John McGraw. It all seems to work."

Epinaud's Owner Refuses \$300,000

By Associated Press. New York, Oct. 21.—After disclosing refusal of \$300,000 for Epinaud, a price which sets a new record in thoroughbred values, Pierre Wertheimer announced today that his famous French horse had run his last race and would be retired to the stud.

M. Wertheimer did not reveal the name of the bidder for Epinaud, but it was said to be a prominent turf man, who believes the French crack, in spite of four straight defeats in this country, is one of the greatest thoroughbreds of all times.

Epinaud came out of his last race at Laurel, Md., last Saturday with a quarter crack in one of his front feet. The injury, which occurred during the race, resulted in the horse's finishing fifth in a field of seven and prompted the decision of M. Wertheimer to retire his star from further competition.

LINCOLN, Neb., Oct. 21.—Coach Brown's Red and Black gridgers, fighting as all Lincoln high teams fight, smashed and tore through the powerful Omaha Central eleven Saturday for a 16 to 6 victory and gained a step nearer state championship honors.

Frank Corrick and "Bud" McBride did most of the work for the capital city team although W. E. and's handling of the team was largely responsible for the Lincoln win. The Red and Black line, averaging nearly 175 pounds to the man, opened big holes in the Purple defense, allowing Captain Teal and his mates to slip through for long gains.

Next to Lincoln's feat, Cambridge-High's 16 to 0 win over Gothenburg was the outstanding feature of the week. Coach John's huskies again demonstrated their great offensive and their right to be named among the championship contenders.

Fremont trimmed Ernie Hubka's York team, 13 to 7, while South Omaha nosed out Creighton Prep, 7 to 0. Beatrice High, Lincoln's next opponent, came to life with a 45 to 0 win over Columbus, and Tecumseh walloped Auburn, 6 to 3. Broken Bow ran away from Ord, 67 to 7. McCook trimmed Holdrege, 33 to 0, while Nelson bumped Superior 42 to 0.
