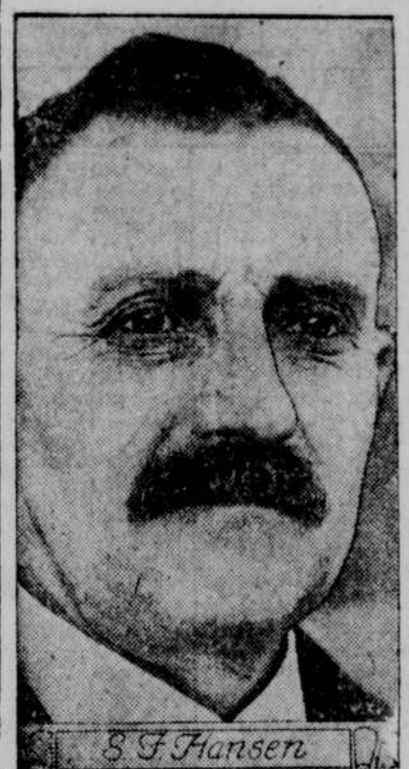


### Wealth of Country Shown as Income Taxes Are Paid Up
