N. P. Dodge Raps **Proposed Change** in Constitution

Plan to Remove Party Designation From Ballot Goes Too Far, Says Primary Law Author.

N. P. Dodge, former member of the legislature from Douglas county, one of the authors of the original primary law, is opposed to the socalled "Sorensen amendment." Nor does he mince words in his denunciation of the Sorensen scheme. He dissects it carefully and shows its inconsistencies and its dangers. an interview on the subject today Mr. Dodge sald:

"I am opposed to the constitutional amendment removing the party designation after the name of the candi date on the ballot. It goes too far. All we need is an amendment to do away with the party circle and thus compel the voters to vote for each office separately.

"As long as we are expected to vote for a lot of minor state officers I think we need more, not less, information about them. I would like to have their life history and their public and private records printed after each candidate's name on the ballot, so I can at least have something upon which to found an opinion as to their qualifications.
