Marquette was taken completely by surprise. The Bluejays, led by right halfback Speicher, just swept up and down the field...

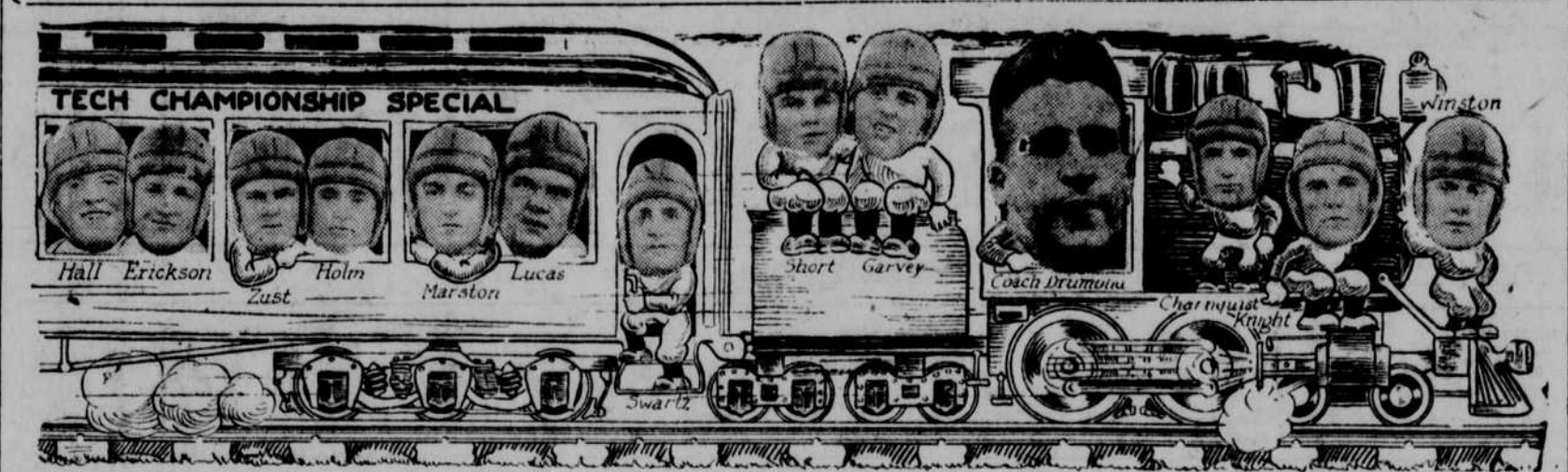

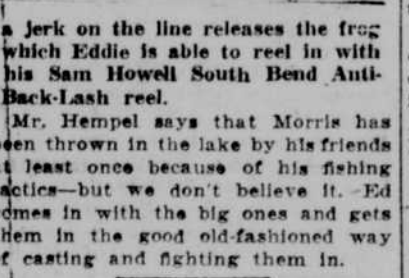

Hornsby Bats .479 in 77 Home Games in Setting Major League Swatting Mark

St. Louis Star Who Eclipsed Wagner's Record by Leading League Five Successive Years, Says He Prefers Right-Handers to Southpaws.

In creating his historical batting average during the 1924 season, Rogers Hornsby featured his attack against the pitchers with the remarkable mark of .479 for his 77 games in his own back yard.

In reaching his 4235 notch Hornsby created a new high mark for batting during these modern days.

Until Hornsby swatted 4235 during the past season the high average listed among the major leaguers was the .4179 for George Sisler with the St. Louis Browns in 1922.

And then it is not forgotten that he is the National leaguer to swing his way to the top five successive years.

In batting .479 at home against 358 for the road Hornsby proves the value of familiar surroundings.

There was one sideline record of considerable proportion for Hornsby during the past summer.

During his 143 games Hornsby was hitless in only 43 and but eight were at home, which means that he belted at least one hit in 65 of his 77 games at home.

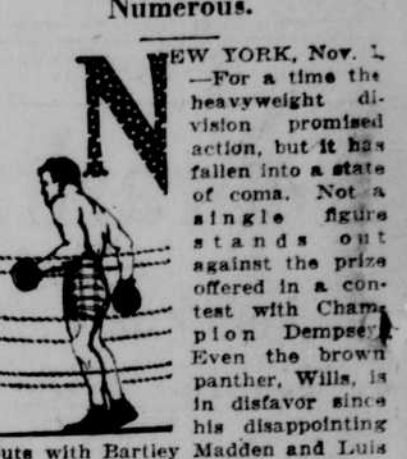
