McLaughlin Sees Coolidge Victor,

Congressman Declares Wisconsin Senator Has Lost Ground as Voters Reflect on His Proposals.

Congressman M. O. McLaughlin of the Fourth Nebraska district, visit ing here on Sunday, predicted a substantial plurality for Coolidge and Dawes in Nebraska.

He closed his speaking campaign last week in Hebron, after delivering 101 talks in 10 days.

"As each day has brought us near er to election day," the congressman said, "It has been apparent that La Follette sentiment has been decreasing. I sincerely believe that La Fol lette will run third in this state and I appreciate that for a while many believed he would run second.

"For one thing, the people have been thinking over La Follette's platform and his ideas on government ownership and control of rail roads and public utilities in general. adn they now realize what this would mean if put into force. For the gov ernment to acquire all of these util ties it would require a bond issue of \$109,000,000,000 and the bonds would be tax free. During my talks I told the people that during the 26 months the government operated the rail roads during the period of the war the cost of operation mounted 46 months and only 1.8 per cent more freight was handled.'

It is notable that during his cam paign Congressman McLaughlin dis cussed issues and omitted personalities entirely from his discussions.

Far East Will Be Present at First **Drug Conference**

U. S. to Be Represented at Second Meet-Plan to Stamp Out Opium Evil.

By Associated Press.

Geneva, Nov. 2.-Delegates wil neet here tomorrow for the first of two international conferences which will attempt to solve the opium evil and, what is of more immediate in erest to the American people, er deavor to set up machinery to check illicit international traffic in habit-forming drugs.

The first conference will be re stricted to those far eastern coun tries where opium smoking prevails and to countries that have posses sions in the far east where opium moking is still permitted under the Hague convention of 1912. The particular object of this conference is to determine an estimate of the requirements of all these countries in raw opium destined for smoking so that the estimate may be passed along to the more general internaional conference, which will open at Geneva, November 17.

The United States will send a delegation to the second conference, which will have representatives from virtually all governments of the world. This conference will aim to limit the production of opium and narcotic drugs to medical and scientific requirements. The present tendency is to set up an effective system of control rather than attempt to prevent production in excess of world requirements. This tendency has been embodied

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
