

Eyes of Football World Focused on Notre Dame-Nebraska Struggle Today

Ideal Weather Forecast For Grid Classic

Cornhuskers Prepared to Break Up Tricky Plays of Coach Rockne's Charges—Record Crowd Predicted.

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Nov. 14.—Notre Dame's football team will start tomorrow's game with Nebraska here under ideal conditions—a firm, fast gridiron and with its greatest strength in the lineup. Nebraska too, is reported at the top of its game.

Coach Knute Rockne of Notre Dame was cheered over the announcement by the weather bureau that the skies would be fair, the ground dry and firm and that "ideal" football weather would prevail. The Hoosiers will depend upon their speed to offset the Cornhuskers' advantage in weight.

Quiet confidence was evident in camp on the eve of the game. Nebraska, the only eleven to defeat Notre Dame in the last two years, is primed to break up the tricky, daring attack of Rockne's charges. Notre Dame, on the other hand, is prepared to throw all the strength it has reserved since the year's opening into the fray. It is no secret that more than victory is their goal.
