LANSING, Mich., Nov. 29.—(Special to The Bee.)—Mike McTigue is well crowded with leaders who are posing peacefully on the shelf—refusing to risk their titles in bouts with fighters capable of giving them anything that resembles a championship argument—while the lesser lights of pugilism entertain fanatics who hope to be furnished with something of a championship nature before long. One of these safety first champions and the one most likely to be relieved of his crown if he ever meets a worthy foe is Mike McTigue, light-heavyweight king. Mike put his padded mittens away in his safe after he won a decision over Battling Siki, the ape-man from Senegal, and has refused to pull them out since, except long enough to collect a champion's prize for engaging in no-decision bouts where his title appeared to be reasonably safe.

Ames, Ia., Nov. 29.—Trainer "Mike" Chambers, who has kept the Iowa State football squad in condition this year, is to be the boxing instructor at Iowa State during the winter, according to T. N. Metcalf, director of athletics.

Trainer Chambers came to Iowa State this year, from the University of Illinois, where he played on the Illini football team and also acted as a rubber and assistant trainer. During this season, Chambers has taken excellent care of the football squad and was responsible for the return to condition of Bill Anderson, tackle, in time for the Drake battle. Chambers has had considerable boxing experience, and although it has not been definitely decided to have a boxing team at Iowa State this year, he will have charge of the boxing classes and will coach the sport during the winter months.
