The present act prohibits of national banks in cities of this size with capital less than \$200,000.

Legislation suggested, according to Dawes, involves no unfair or discriminatory provisions against state banks and trust companies.

"National banks," he added, "afford a strong, aggressive and permanent membership, having resources of over \$23,000,000,000 and ranging in size from the greatest bank in the world to the small neighborhood institu-

"It is unthinkable that, either through direct act or neglect, the United States government should permit dissolution of such an institution or lose its control over it.

"In spite of the fact that more state and national banks suspended or falled during the past year than in any one year since the lauguration of the national banking system, na tional banks generally withstood the strain and continued to maintain an outstanding influence in the financial system of the nation."
