So we were left on this desolate, wind-swept remnant of an ancient volcano without even a radio. Mr. Goss had told us to make ourselves at home in his trading Some of us bunked alongside store. stacks of flour and piles of condensed milk, while the rest slept in the attic. We elevated our bunks on boxes to keep the rats from running over us. I don't mention the rats, however, out of disrespect for our big-hearted host.
