

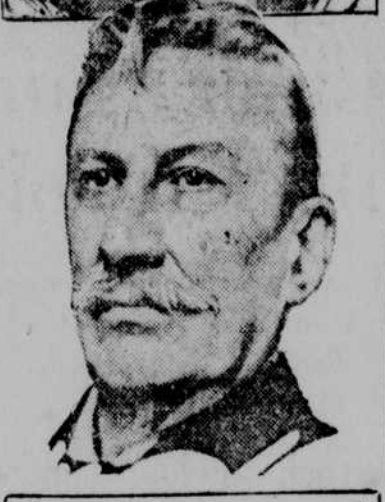
Legion Obtains Aid for 20 of 34 Injured Veterans

Titian-Haired Helen Abandons Charge of Conspiracy Against W. E. D. Stokes

Ill Health Given as Cause of Dropping Action; Trial Scheduled to Start Monday.

By International News Service. Chicago, Jan. 10.—W. E. D. Stokes, millionaire sportsman of New York and battle-scarred veteran of numerous affairs of the heart, will not be prosecuted in Chicago by his titian-haired Helen, according to a letter from his wife received here today.

The charges were the outgrowth of the divorce trial in New York last year, which attracted nationwide publicity. The charge was directly based on evidence that led the Cook county grand jury to indict Stokes and others for alleged conspiracy to show Mrs. Stokes as an inmate of a notorious house in Chicago. It was claimed by Mrs. Stokes' side in the New York trial that this was false.

Senate Tackles Muscle Shoals
