President Orders Department Heads to Slice Expense of Government.

By International News Service. Washington, Jan. 27 .- "Reduce your

expenses and cut your pay rolls." The army of bureau chiefs and department heads that constitute the machinery of the federal government had this direct order today from Presi dent Coolidge. It is his first general order of the new year, and he left no doubt in the minds of the several hundred bureau heads who heard it that only strict compliance with i will find favor at the White House.

The expenditures for 1925, Mr. Cool idge said, must be brought at least \$62,000,000 under the budget estimates already sent to congress. This cut will be necessary, he said, to bring the total expenses for running the government this year under the \$3,000,000,000 mark.

The president believes there ar too many names on the federal pay roll. He advised the department chiefs to scan their personal lists and wherever it is found possible to elim If his recommendations are success fully executed, the president declared, it will mean further tax reduction by the new 69th congres, due to convene in December.
