Y. W. C. A. 1924 Report

The year 1924 proved one of the busiest and most successful in the Young Women's Christian association. A study of the following interesting report reveals the following interesting facts:
Total membership, 1,822.
The membership at North Side Branch (colored) has almost doubled during the year.
The Y. W. C. A. has 15 clubs, with an enrollment of 184 and attendance of 16,224.
Clubs of business and professional women, 11, enrollment 272, attendance 3,098.
The Educational Department had a total enrollment of 1,100, with classes of 12 subjects.
Total attendance at Sunday afternoon musicales and vespers, 2,304.
The Health Education department has an enrollment of 418 trainees.
One Hundred thirty-four cases were registered with the Social Service exchange.
Through the Room Registry 526 were placed in personally investigated rooms.
The secretary has had 1,214 interviews, some of which were problem cases and were cleared through the Social Service exchange and handled in co-operation with other social agencies.
Employment bureau placed 1,220 applicants, showing a gain of 12 per cent over 1923, this in view of a really serious employment situation at times. 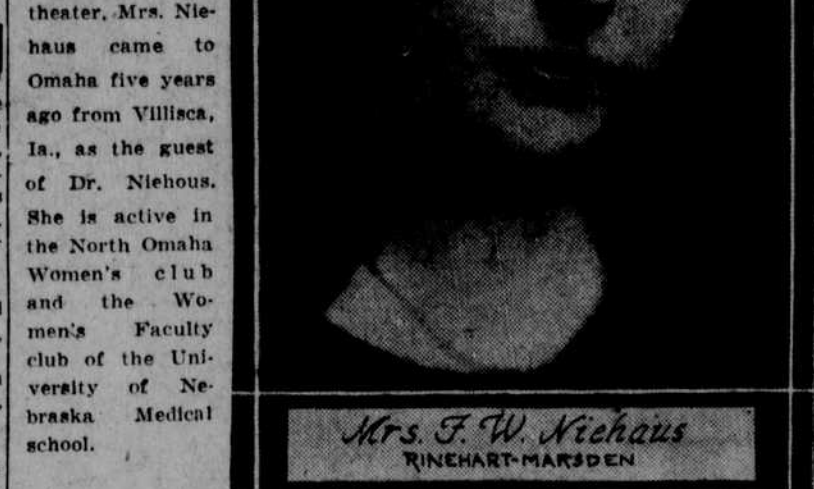

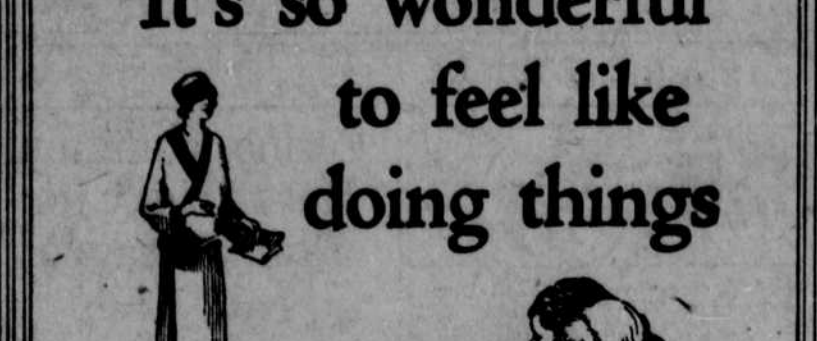
