

Bellome Freed in Slaying Case

Jury Out 24 Hours in Santoro Salerno Murder Trial.

Rocco Bellome left the courthouse at 10:45 Thursday morning a free man. Just 24 hours before, a jury had gone into session to determine whether he was guilty of first degree murder. Bellome was charged by the

state with having shot and killed Santoro Salerno, in the most recent killing in Little Italy. Salerno was shot when leaving the home of Lucy Bell at Twenty-second and Pacific streets the night of September 17. Until an hour before the "not guilty" verdict was reached, the jury was evenly divided, six favoring acquittal and six favoring conviction. A clerk of the court read the verdict at 10, just 23 hours and 15 minutes after the matter had been placed in the hands of the jury. Bellome sat, leaning forward in his chair, his swarthy countenance drawn, as the jurors filed back to their places in the courtroom. A repressed smile of happiness

crept over his face as he heard the verdict. He sat quietly in his chair as Judge Goss thanked the jurors for their service and they filed from the courtroom. "You are discharged," said Judge Goss. Bellome rose hesitatingly, apparently not quite comprehending the situation. Then, as officers of the court and several Italian friends shook his head and congratulated him, a realization of his freedom came to him and he walked towards the door. "Goodby, Judge," he said, turning and raising a hand and smiling. With this remark he had practically exhausted his store of English and went

forth without further delay. It was for the jury to decide whether Bellome should go free or be sentenced for first degree murder. Counsel for the state and defense signed an agreement that manslaughter and second degree charges be eliminated from consideration, and Judge Goss had so instructed the jurors. The crowd of spectators, mostly Italians, which had filled the big courtroom during the trial, was missing when the verdict was given. There had been rumors of impending violence due to feeling among Italians, and Judge Goss had warned those attending the trial that anyone found carrying a weapon would be dealt with severely.

Closed Car Is Show Feature

Coaches Favored This Season; Balloon Tires Big Success.

New methods of balancing reciprocating parts in eliminating the vibration in the 1925 eight-cylinder motors and the adoption of a system which supplies lubrication to moving parts is in almost general use. The models on display at the show

will be equipped mostly with balloon type tires. These tires have found great favor with the motorist. The problem of chains and skidding has been almost eliminated and the ease and service that balloon cords give makes luxurious traveling easy even in the lighter, less expensive cars. The full-sized balloon has definitely established its ability to lengthen the life of the car and the mileage given has exceeded the fondest hopes of tire engineers. The balloon tire, if it is to be a success, must be built with a light resilient carcass and of the most durable cord fabric. The additional air capacity alone cannot hope to give

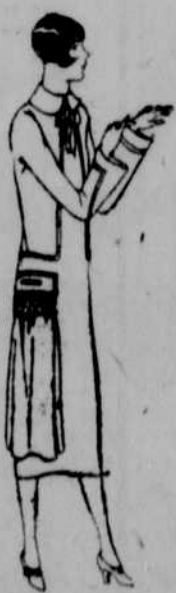
