

Cosmo Hamilton Bemoans Bequest

Inheritance Nothing But Expense, Famous Writer Says; Quits Bath for Chat.

Cosmo Hamilton, writer of "The Blindness of Virtue," "Scandal" and 27 other successful plays, climbed out of his bath at the Hotel Fontenelle Friday noon to meet the interviewer. "I haven't the slightest idea what I am going to say when I speak before the Drama League this afternoon," he declared. "I shall talk about the theater but I'm in a funk now and feel needles sticking me right in the solar plexus. Silly, I know, but it's always so. I'm not a lecturer.

"Yes, Sir Philip Gibbs is my blood brother. Here's how it is. We were both born Hamilton Gibbs. I had an uncle, Hamilton, a bachelor. Wanted to leave his property. Under English law it must be left to one of the same name. So I changed my name to Cosmo Hamilton at his request. Cost me a thousand pounds. And the property I inherited in Ireland has been nothing but an expense to me. I let the farmers off without paying their rent and I pay the taxes.


