

### Lumber Dealers of State Meet Here February 18

Nebraska Association and Cornhusker Knothole Club in Three-Day Joint Session.

Lumber dealers from all parts of Nebraska will meet in Omaha February 18 for the 35th annual convention of the Nebraska Lumber Dealers' association and the first annual institute of the Cornhusker Knothole club, which will meet in joint session at the Rome hotel. The meeting will last for three days.

The principal speakers at the convention sessions will be R. E. Saberson of Minneapolis, who will speak on "How to Make Profits in 1925," Porter E. Stone of Kansas City, who will tell "How to Get Insurance at Cost," and Harvey C. Kendall of Lincoln, who will discuss "Why Lumbermen Don't Advertise."

Short talks on different phases of the lumber business will be made by Sam Ruth, John Hutchinson, Harry Rivett, Earl Hlatt, Rex Davies, H. W. Tool, Claude Baum, Slim Hannibal, Elmer Coates and H. E. Dole.

A banquet for retailers only will be held Wednesday evening, and the retailers will be the guests of the salesmen at a banquet Thursday evening at Hotel Rome.

Wives of the delegates will be guests at a tea Wednesday afternoon, a theater party Wednesday evening and a luncheon Thursday noon.

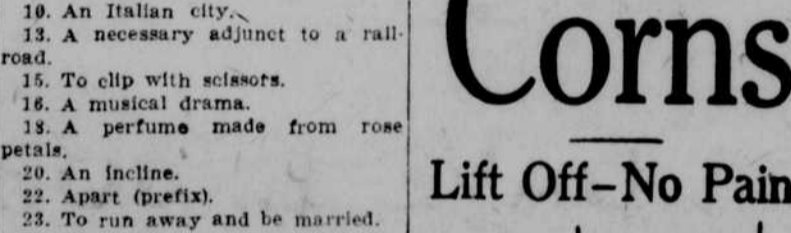

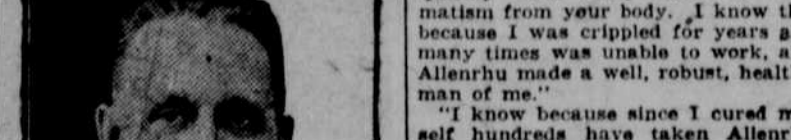

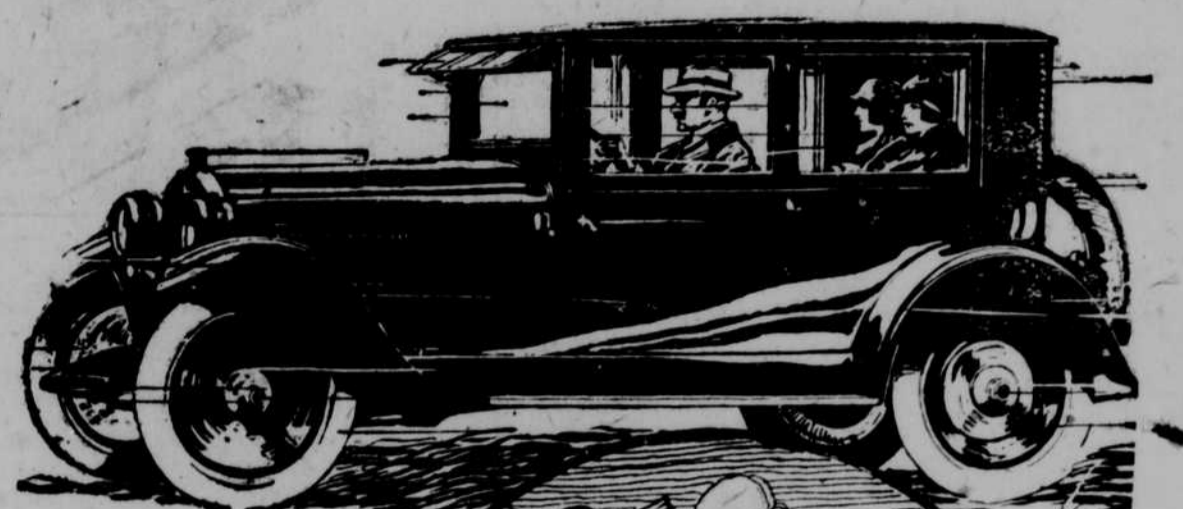
