Coach Schulte to Select 16 Men From 22 on List; Crew Is Training Hard.



INCOLN, March 16.—Coach Schulte this evening announced a list of men from which the tracksters will be selected to enter the Missouri valley indoor meet Saturday at Kansas City.

Critch, the quarter miler, will go to Kansas City, but he pulled a muscle not long ago, and may not be able to run.

Locke, Dailey, Rhodes, Reese and Beerle are short sprint men and most of them have been doing some handling work.

Kremlmeyer, the big shot putter, is on the list, and as he has been doing nothing but the shot putting will enter this event if any.

The Husker cinder men have been going through some intensive training on the indoor track for the Missouri valley meet, as Schulte has looked upon this as the biggest of the indoor affairs of the season, and has shaped his men for it.
