

Shipping Board Asks New Ruling

Members Consider Two Prop-ositions for Sale of Five of Its Vessels.

Washington, March 20.—Members of the shipping board have asked its general counsel for a ruling on its right to enter into an agreement such as was proposed by the Pacific Mail company yesterday for acquisition of five of its president-type vessels which it now operates.

The Pacific Mail company's bid for the ships provides formation of a new corporation, \$5,500,000 of the preferred stock of which would be taken over by the board in part payment for the vessels. The board would name seven of the new corporation's 11 directors. A bid by the Dollar Steamship company for the same vessels offered to purchase them outright for \$5,025,000.

Board members, in considering the Pacific Mail proposal, recalled that in 1923 Attorney General Daugherty, in an opinion requested by the board, held that it did not have the right to enter into a similar agreement, and they want to know whether the present bid is likewise unacceptable.

There were some indications that both bids, on which a decision is expected late next week, might be rejected, although that of the Dollar company has been received favorably by several board members, especially because of its provision for outright purchase of the vessels.

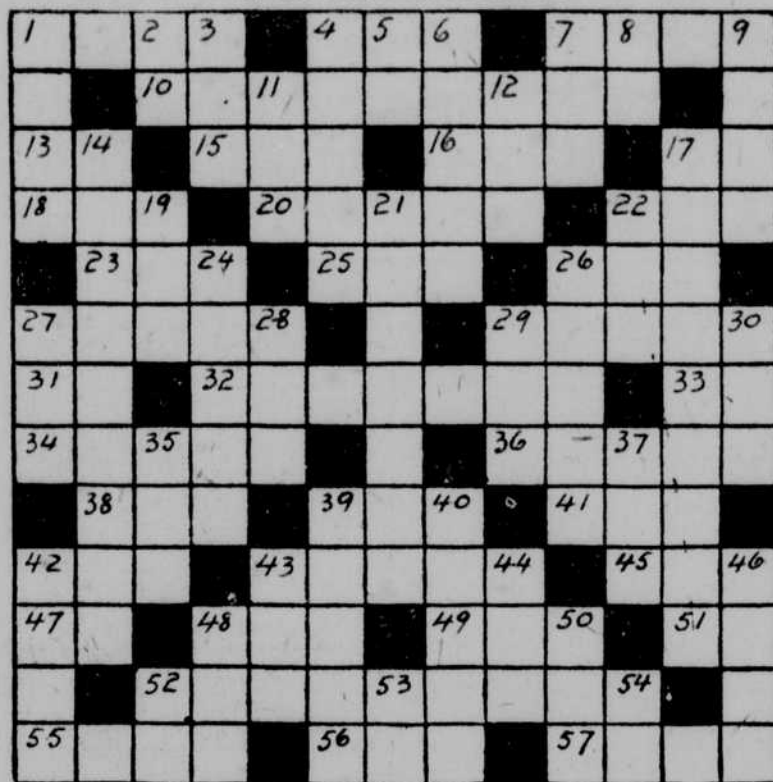
Other members, however, are represented as questioning the policy of the Dollar company in bidding for the vessels now operated by the Pacific Mail, while making no move to acquire five other vessels of the same type it now operates to ports in the Orient. This situation raised a question as to the advisability of selling of the 10 ships to the Dollar company for private operation at the same time it would be operating five more, virtually in competition with its own, on behalf of the shipping board to the same ports.
