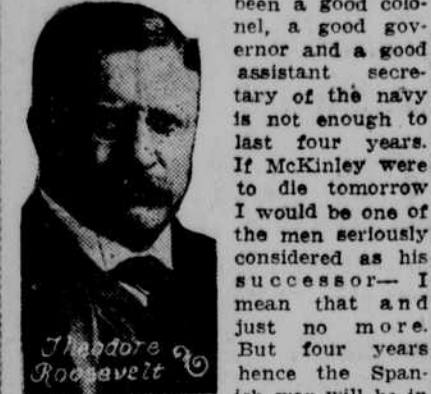


Lodge Advises T. R. to Take Berth on National Ticket

McKinley Favors Colonel as Running Mate in 1900 Campaign; Teddy in Quandary.

(Copyright, 1925.) Senator Lodge was from the beginning in favor of Roosevelt's running for vice-president, but the latter had to try for re-election as governor.

Dear Cabot: About the vice-presidency: It seems to me that the chance of my being a presidential candidate is too small to warrant very serious consideration at present.



There therefore remains the question of what each office is by itself. The vice-presidency is a most honorable office, but for a young man there is not much to do. It is infinitely better than many other positions, but it hardly seems to me as good as being governor of this state, which is a pretty important state.

Then, while it is very unlikely that I could be president, there is a chance of my being something else—governor general of the Philippines, of a cabinet officer, or perchance in the remote future, senator. Mind you, I do not think that any of these things are likely, but at least there is sufficient chance to warrant my taking them seriously, while I do not think the chance for the vice-presidency sufficient to warrant my taking it seriously.

When the following letter was written Senator Platt had at last told Governor Roosevelt of his (Platt's) wish to have Roosevelt run for the vice-presidency.

STATE OF NEW YORK, EXECUTIVE CHAMBER ALBANY Dec. 30, 1925. Hon. H. C. Lodge, Senate Chamber, Washington, D. C.

Dear Cabot: As you know, the thing I should really like to do would be to be the first civil governor general of the Philippines. I believe I could do that job, and it is a job emphatically worth doing.

Platt told me that Root would not be vice president because the president wished him to remain in his cabinet. Yesterday I heard, practically at first hand from the White House, that it was substantially agreed that Root was to be vice president.
