It is thoroughly waterproofed and is made in white, cream, buff, pink, light drab and pearl gray. The colors are mixed by machinery and all the workman on the job has to do is to mix it with water in orde to have it ready to apply.

The Konkrete Exterior Stucco com pany guarantees it to be permanent whether applied on concrete walls, brick, tile or wood. In applying on wooden houses a steel lath is used.


