

May Wheat Weaker After False Bulge, Finally Tumbling

Entire Grain List Dragged
Down With Wheat; Heavy
Selling on Flurries; No
News Blamed.

Chicago, April 15.—After a false bulge during the early minutes of trade May wheat was off 2c to 2½c lower. Receipts, however, were still small on the crop, and the market seemed ready to buy. There was not enough grain available to make the market and buyers were out of the market entirely.

Corn was quoted around 1c higher, corn only a fair demand. Receipts were 4c each.

Oats sold 4c to 5c lower with only a moderate demand.

Rye and barley were quoted nominally lower.

NEW YORK SUGAR.

New York, April 15.—The market was new record for the year was established.

Pearl Rican sugar sold at 42c per pound.

The business was principally in nearby refineries.

Sales included 15,000 bags of Cuban for immediate shipment at 42c; 6,000 bags for May shipment at 42c; 10,000 bags for month at 41c and 6,000 bags at 41c; also 16,000 bags of Cuban for May shipment at 41c.

Raw sugar futures followed the decline in price for the first time in nearly two months, selling into new low ground for the season.

Businesses with trade and Cuban companies showed a great deal of confidence in the market.

As the market had been underfed and underdone, floor stocks were light and shallow, as buyers were operating cautiously and were not buying heavily.
