BANKS SUED FOR

Bonding Companies of Ex-County Treasurer Seeks to Recover \$33,968.

Two suits in connection with the alleged shortage in the accounts of 3. M. Souder, former treasurer of incoln county, were filed in United States district court Tuesday by the Fidelity and Deposit company and anty company, both of Baltimore, local chapter at luncheon at Hotel and the American Surety company Fontenelle. of New York, through their attorneys, Montgomery, Hall & Young, Omaha, and William E. Shuman. North Platte. The defendants are meeting Wednesday night at Hotel the Union State bank of North Platte and the Farmers' State bank of Sutherland.

Fontenelle, "Liftl" is an abbreviation of "life" and "philosophy. Officers are: Miss Mary Krebs, president; Miss Sutherland.

Claim \$69,000 Loss.

The three companies alleged they furnished bonds for Souder and paid more than \$69,000 to Lincoln county to cover the county treasurer's shortage. They now seek to recover a portion of the amount paid pastor of the Presbyterian church of by them to cover the deficit.

In their first petition the bonding companies charge that the Union State bank aided Souder in converting \$30,000 of the county's money, claiming that the former county treasurer deposited with that bank to his personal account Liberty bonds nd securities of Lincoln county. the deposits were made, they allege to cover Souder's overdrafts on the

Charge Names Forged.

The petition charges that Souder with the assistance and connivance of the bank, employed several methods of converting county money to his own use. Some of these alleged methods are:

Drawing of county treasurer checks for county moneys payable to the Union State bank, which would endirse the checks and deposit them to Souder's personal ac-

Drawing of county checks payable to himself and depositing them in his personal account.

Drawing county checks payable to various citizens of the county forging their names on the backs of the checks and depositing them to his account.

Depositing to his personal ac count many checks of taxpayers, county securities and Liberty bonds. The plaintiffs ask the court for an investigation and accounting of all the moneys taken by Souder through the bank and that they be given judg ment for the amount found so con-

Claim Illegally Drawn. In the petition against the Farmers' State bank the bonding com panies claim that drainage district money deposited in the bank could only be drawn out upon warrants signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary of the board of county supervisors, but that this ank ignored this provision and per ed Souder to check out this money

and convert it to his own use. Representatives of the bonding companies, who made an investiga-tion of the facts in connection with Meredith Ave. 44 feet e. of 27th Souder's shortage, state that these H are the only suits which will be start ed against any banks on account of the Souder alleged shortage, as no other banks were connected with al-

leged questionable transactions. Souder was found guilty in connec

tion with the burning of the Lincoln county court house on April 29, 1923, by a jury on December 22, 1923. He immediately appealed his case.

Souder is now serving a sentence of from one to 20 years in the state penitentiary on the arson charge.

Souder, Arthur S. Allen, Lincoln county treasurer, and Carl R. Goucher, salesman of the Omaha Printing company, were arrested following the investigation into the burning of the courthouse at North Platte. It was charged at their trials that the structure was fired in an attempt to destroy the evidence of Souder's embezzlements.

Allen is now serving an indeterminate sentence of one to 10 years in the penitentiary. Goucher received the same sentence on a forgery charge in Lincoln county district court.

He appealed his case to the state supereme court, which Thursday reversed the sentence of the lower court on a technicality and remanded the case to district court for new trial.


