

## WESTERN CANADA'S HAPPY PROSPECTS.

In no year since the development of Western Canada began has spring brought a brighter outlook than it brings this year. In no preceding spring has there been greater assurance of advancing development and prosperity. The movement of immigration has already assumed large proportions, and is as desirable in character as it is satisfactory in volume; from across the Atlantic sturdy, industrious and thrifty newcomers are arriving in large numbers, homeseekers from Ontario and the other older Provinces are coming in a steady stream, and from across the international boundary a movement is already in full flow, which, it is confidently predicted, will beat the records of all previous years; special settlers' trains are crossing the line, loaded with effects, actual material wealth being thus brought into the country at the rate of millions of dollars' worth monthly.

The movement is so unprecedentedly large that extra Dominion Immigration officials have had to be provided at both North Portal and at Emerson, and it is estimated that the total number of new settlers from the United States this year will be 70,000, at least, and may run well up toward 100,000. Last year's total of new settlers from the South was 53,723; thus the area that will be placed in wheat and other grains this year will greatly exceed that of last year. Settlers are making extraordinary efforts to get on their lands and begin seeding operations. The price of wheat now, away above the dollar mark, is incentive enough, and when one has in view the splendid results that the past few years have shown, it is not to be wondered at that the present will be the banner year for immigration to Canada. 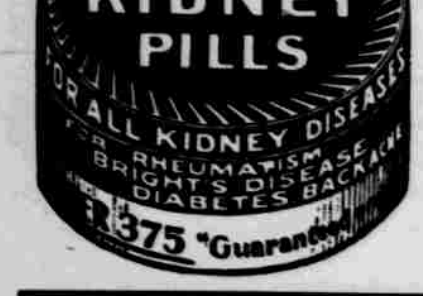

**Awake to Danger of Tuberculosis.**  
The number of state and local anti-tuberculosis societies in the United States has shown over 100 per cent. increase during the past year; the number of sanatoria and hospitals for tuberculosis, nearly 30 per cent. increase; and the number of special tuberculosis dispensaries and clinics, over 40 per cent. increase. The rate of increase in the number of workers is estimated at over 200 per cent., and the amounts given for tuberculosis relief have been doubled during the year. Thirty-three legislatures, out of 33 in session up to May 1, 1909, have been considering laws pertaining to the prevention or treatment of tuberculosis. In a large number of states legislation affecting this subject has already been enacted, and more laws will be passed before the close of the spring session.

## RACE FOR MAJOR LEAGUE PENNANTS

WILL BE WARM ACCORDING TO OPINIONS OF PRESIDENTS PULLIAM AND JOHNSON.

## NEW MANAGERS IN NATIONAL

Will Put Up Hot Fight Against First Division Teams—Head of American League Asserts Belief That Detroit Will Not Make Runaway Race of Contest.

Harry C. Pulliam, president of the National league, and Ban Johnson, president of the American league, look for warm races for the championship bunting in their respective organizations. In a recent interview on the outlook for the season, Mr. Pulliam said:

"In forecasting the championship race of 1909 in the National league one has but to recall the exciting and grueling struggle of 1908 and note the elements that go to make repetition of that memorable campaign possible and very probable. Chicago, the winner of both the National and world's championship, will enter the race the same great machine it was last year, and it is reasonable to suppose it will not be handicapped by the abnormal number of accidents that it had last season. To offset this it will meet stronger adversaries."

"New York has undoubtedly been strengthened by the additions to its team, notably in the pitching department, by the securing of Marquard, Raymond and Durham. Pittsburgh, the club that came within one game of the championship without a regular first baseman, has not only filled the vacancy there, but has strengthened the other departments. Philadelphia will have to be considered before the championship honors are awarded. This team gave evidences last year of its class, and the additional strength added should show results."

"The clubs that finished in the second division last year will all have new managers—Griffith in Cincinnati, Bowerman in Boston, Lumley in Brooklyn and Bresnahan in St. Louis. Of these Griffith has won his spurs in the managerial field, while the others have their careers before them. All have brilliant records as players and they will bring to their new duties those qualities that showed their class as players and marked them for leadership. These clubs have all been strengthened by judicious deals and the acquisition of players from the minor leagues, and under the direction of the new managements they should all show improvement over the form of 1908."

"The season of 1908 was memorable for not only its spectacular rise and finish, but also the great interest shown by the public, the attendance being the highest in the history of the league. I look for a continuation of this interest, as I am sure the race will be the most open in years."

Mr. Johnson does not share the belief frequently expressed during the training season that the Detroit Tigers will have a walkaway in the American league. He says: "There have been some predictions that Detroit will make a runaway race in the American league championship contest this season. I do not share in this belief. Detroit staggered over the chalk line last fall and won by a very narrow margin the year previous. The club has been strengthened some this winter, but to no greater extent than Cleveland and St. Louis. The 'naps' and 'browns' have materially bettered their line-up, and hopes are kindled high among the fans at Cleveland, and the many thousands who support the American league club in the city by the big bridge. The veteran 'Cy' Young will prove a tower of strength to Lajoie and his tribe, while Criger will bolster the catching department of the St. Louis Browns."

"It is difficult to predict how great a loss the absence of Jones will be in the playing strength of the White Sox. Comiskey was always the guiding spirit, but he must have the right material to secure the highest results."

"From Philadelphia comes the report that Connie Mack has unbounded faith in his band of rejuvenated Quakers. The prediction is made that he has a club that is a pennant possibility. Down at Washington the management has been steadily building to a major league standard, and the team of this year is far the best that ever represented the capital. Few, if any, predict a pennant for the Senators, but the club will surely play a most important part in the fight."

It is hard to analyze the worth and strength of the New York club. Many changes have been made, but a hard campaign can alone determine the value of the team. Under a new leadership much better results may be secured. Boston has one of the speediest teams in the American league, but, unfortunately, is overstocked with left-hand batters. The chief point of concern, however, is the pitching department. Should the box men come up to the standard, Boston will occupy a creditable position in the race next fall."

**Says Baserunning Is on Decline.**  
"Baserunning in the big leagues isn't what it used to be," says Billy Hamilton, the old-time champion. "Nowadays pitchers can't make those balking feints and it's easier for the runners to get away. But they won't take the chances we used to take, and the prettiest feature of baseball is not developing as it should."

## CLEAR UP ALL BAD ODORS.
