BLAIR, NEBR.

En af vor Bys gamle, agtværdige Borgere, Fred H. Matthiesen, blev stød til Hvide paa Kirkegaarden her i Fredags. Den afdøde var født paa Als, Sønderjylland, 22. Marts 1844. I 1869 kom han til Amerika, næste Aar til Blair. Her begyndte han Købmandsforretning (General Merchandise) sammen med en Mr. Logan. I 1880 trak Mr. Logan sig tilbage, og Chr. Matthiesen traadte i hans Sted, saa Forretningen siden dreves under Navnet Matthiesen Bro's. Saaledes dreves Forretningen til i Halvfemserne. Da opgav Brodrene Forretningen, Fred Matthiesens Søn Edward begyndte Herreskivperingsforretning, og Faderen sammen med andre begyndte Bankforretning. I flere Aar har den afdøde været svagelig og mest opholdt sig i Los Angeles, Cal., hvor han døde den 20. Jan. Sonnen var rejst derud for at se sin Fader paa Dødslejet, og han førte saa Faderens Lig med sig hjem, hvor det saa Fredag den 24. ds. blev ført lige til Graven, hvor Episkopalpræsten Rev. Marsh udførte Begravelses-Ceremonien efter sin Kirkes Ritual. Skønt Fred Matthiesen kunde tale Dansk, regnedes han, og regnede sig selv, for tysk. Han efterlader Hustru, en Søn og tre Døtre.—En Broder til ham, M. Matthiesen, døde her for nogle Aar siden. Chris Matthiesen lever endnu.

State of Nebraska

Department of Health, Lincoln.

The State Department of Health held its recent conference to decide principally two things.

First: Are the various counties, cities and villages sufficiently organized to render efficient aid to their health department in putting down this epidemic? Second: In the event that the State Department of Health were to declare Influenza an absolutely quarantinable disease, would the counties, cities and villages see that the quarantine was promptly enforced and strictly maintained?

The first proposition was unanimously answered in the affirmative, the second almost so, by representatives from almost every county in the state. The State Department of Health has accordingly made this an absolutely quarantinable disease and it is expected that the counties, cities and villages in whose jurisdiction cases occur, will see that the regulations are obeyed and violations promptly prosecuted.

DANA NEWS.

During the war five former Dana students died in army service either on the battle field of France or in army camps. At Dana a memorial program was prepared. Five blue stars will be replaced by gold.

This program was to have been rendered Sunday afternoon, January 26. This, however, was hindered by Spanish Influenza. Again we have a few cases. At present all the patients are improving. Unless we get more cases we hope to be all over it soon. The program will be rendered at some later date.

Nearly two weeks ago, Fred H. Lund, the past four years a Dana student, spent several days with us. He had just received his discharge from army service. He had encouraging things to tell about the work carried out by Lutheran Brotherhood at Camp Dodge where he was stationed. Mr. Lund is now taking up work at the University of Nebraska preparatory to theology.

Martin L. Kirkegaard, teacher of our commercial department, returned Sunday from a trip to Lincoln. At the University of Nebraska he took his last examination before he receives the A. B. degree from that institution.

Marius Sørensen is back from overseas service. First he served on the Mexican frontier, later on in France. Mr. Sørensen is the first of our overseas boys to visit Dana.

Our young men who are returning from army service have shown that they are inferior to none. The same, we believe, holds true for Dana College students in general. The young men at this institution are preparing for a life work. Many are planning on taking up a special work in our church. Our time is a

time of keen competition. To meet this successfully the best training is necessary. We see no reason why we in our church work should be inferior. We are not content to be inferior in this important work. We will be nothing less than men of first rank, capable and able of holding our places along with the best. Jofna C. Romer.

SAMARBEJDE I VOR JAPAN-MISSION.

(Fortsat fra 5. Side.)

That we hereby ask the Foreign Mission Board of the United Lutheran Church in America to effect, if possible, a relationship with the Foreign Mission Society of the United Danish Ev. Lutheran Church of America, where and the missionaries of the United Danish Ev. Lutheran Church of America in Japan and the missionaries of the United Lutheran Church of America in this field, may be one body, engaged in one unified work, irrespective of distinctions in supporting Boards; and, further, be it Resolved:

That we do hereby most cordially invite the Mission of the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church of America likewise to take such measures as may effect continued co-operation, and, if possible, some arrangement by which it may become an integral part of one Japan Mission.

AND WHEREAS,

The missionaries of the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, in special session, held separately, the same day and place, took the following action:

Whereas it is our deep conviction that the interests of the Lutheran Church in Japan are best served if they are taken care of by one organization; be it

Resolved:—

That we, the undersigned representatives of the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, express our willingness and desire to enter into full and integral union with the representatives of the new United Lutheran Church of America, and that we ask them to urge their home Board, we will urge ours, to agree to this solution of the new conditions arising from the merger of two of the bodies represented in the present Joint Conference of Lutheran Missions Co-operating in Japan; and, be it further

Resolved:

- That we suggest (1) That the United Lutheran Church of America invite one or more representatives of the United Danish Ev. Lutheran Church of America to sit with their Japan Committee, deliberating and deciding questions concerning the work in Japan: 2. That the United Danish Ev. Lutheran Church of America continue to maintain the same relations with the work in Japan, supporting the same persons and the same stations as hitherto, and as many additional persons or stations in the future as may be possible for them; and (3.) That thus all workers, not only the Japanese as hitherto, but also the foreign hereafter, be under the same control and subject to the same rules and regulations, thereby ensuring that unity which we deem essential for the highest interests of our beloved Lutheran Church and its work of preaching the Gospel of Christ in Japan. (3.) That we, each and all, pledge ourselves to uphold the principles underlying the above actions, praying and laboring to the end that they may be carried out to the fullest possible extent.

The Church Council of the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church of America was in session Nov. 14th and 15th., at the parsonage of Our Saviour's Sean, Luth. Church, Council Bluffs, Iowa.

Communications in the form of lengthy letters from our missionaries in Japan were read and considered.

The 14th of November The General Synod, General Council and United Synod South of the Lutheran Church were in session in New York City for the purpose of consolidating the Three Bodies into one: "The United Lutheran Church of America."

Since 1909 the General Council, United Synod South and the United Danish Lutheran Church have worked together in the mission field in Japan as a joint conference. Now that the above said churches are consolidated, it is the intention to unite the last three mentioned churches in Japan to one Japanese Lutheran Church sustained by the home churches and governed by a united board of foreign mission, on which our United Danish Church should have at least one member.

After serious consideration the following resolutions were passed:

- 1. The board is grateful to God and our missionaries for the splendid work performed in our mission field in Japan heretofore as also for the co-operation with the General Council and United Synod South—especially the school work.
2. The board gives its hearty approval of the unification of the churches in the mission field in Japan to-wit:—"The United Lutheran Church of America," and "The United Danish Lutheran Church of America" to be consolidated into one Japanese Lutheran Church on the ground of all our missionaries united and unanimous proposal.
3. The board recommends these propositions to adoption at the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church's next annual meeting.
4. The board elects a representative to meet and confer with the United Lutheran Church committee on foreign mission in Japan.
5. Rev. I. Gertsen, Council Bluffs was elected.
6. A Finish Lutheran Mission in north Japan which had not been in communication with its home church during the war hav-
