### Rotten St. Louis

Editor Independent: That the democrats will carry the spring elections here by an overwhelming majority is a foregone conclusion. The reasons for this are not the much-abused Nesbit law and police interference at the polls, as has been alleged, but republican rascality which has been disclosed in both city and national administrations is causing decent republicans to blush and stay at home or go to the polls and vote the democratic ticket.

The Zeigenheim city administration was one which so reeked with boodling, bribery, misuse of money and padded pay rolls that the convictions and sentences to the penitentiary of members of the council and house of delegates made the unsuspecting stand aghast at the startling revelations.

It seems that President Roosevelt and Postmaster General Payne have connived to condone this crime, and suppress, as far as possible, the publication of the facts concerning it. People say that while President Roosevelt has the reputation of being a brave man he is a moral coward and hypocrite, or he would not allow Mr. Baumhoff to retain this position after such charges had been proven by the affidavits of reputable young ladies. It seems that the republican administration of national affairs is as rotten as was that of this city under Zeigenheim and his republican outfit.
