IOWA POPULISTS

Recent Meeting Held and Organization Rejuvenated—Ready for the Fray in Dead Earnest

It will be remembered that The Independent published a call for meeting of Iowa populists, to be held at Albia, March 17. The following, quoted from the Southern Iowa Educator, will show that the "kangaroo" socialists have not captured all of those who formerly stood by the Omaha platform:

The state conference of the Iowa populists, March 17, put new vim in to the old war horses and made the young feel like there were yet something worth living for. Early in the morning many young fellows near by began to call at the office of the Educator to see about the conference, also

several old-timers came early, and letters came pouring in giving those in attendance good advice and urging the boys to keep in the middle of the road and be faithful to the end.

The meeting was called to order by S. M. Harvey at 2 o'clock and the object of the meeting laid before the conference. It was moved and carried that the chair appoint a committee of three to select a chairman and secretary for the conference; this was done and that committee named J. R. Norman of the Educator for chairman and S. M. Harvey of Des Moines for secretary, which was ratified by a unanimous vote of the conference.

The next business was the reading of communications and the plan to pursue in the reorganization of the state. This brought out quite a heated debate and finally it was agreed

to that each and every populist in the state should consider himself a committee of one and open up a correspondence with every reformer he knew in the state that would like to see the people's party principles incorporated into law and send their names and postoffice addresses in to the chairman of the state central committee of Iowa. This motion carried by a unanimous vote, the Omaha platform, with direct legislation added, was made the test of true populism without any opposing voices. It was also agreed that the chairman of the state central committee should ask all populists and sympathizers with this reform movement to send the chairman some funds at once to help perfect the organization all over our state. Those present started the good work along by leaving some cash with

the chairman of the state central committee.

At the close of the conference J. R. Norman was elected chairman of the state central committee of the people's party and S. M. Harvey of Des Moines secretary of the state central committee; the Southern Iowa Educator was chosen for the official organ of the Iowa people's party.

A more enthusiastic meeting in Iowa was never held and a more determined set could not have had a conference; yet harmony prevailed. The meeting was not large, but well represented and the good intent was shown by the eagerness to have things done so all could understand it and satisfactory to all that were present, which was done right.
