It will be remembered that The Independent published a call for meeting of Iowa populists, to be held at Al-bia, March 17. The following, quoted from the Southern Iowa Educator, will show that the "kangaroo" socialists have not captured all of those who formerly stood by the Omaha platform:

several old-timers came early, and letters came pouring in giving those in attendance good advice and urging the boys to keep in the middle of the road and be faithful to the end.

The meeting was called to order by S. M. Harvey at 2 o'clock and the object of the meeting laid before the conference. It was moved and carried that the chair appoint a committee of three to select a chairman and secretary for the conferece; this was done and that committee named J. R. Norman of the Educator for chairman and S. M. Harvey of Des Moines for secretary, which was ratified by a unanimous vote of the conference.

The meeting was not large, but well represented and the good intent was shown by the eagerness to have things done so all could understand it and satisfactory to all that were present. which was done right.
