We ought to get our own new mill on the ground and ready for operation as soon as possible."

There is nothing new in the strike. Packers are making a bluff of doing business, but it is on a very limited scale. Tuesday's receipts were more than they wanted and Wednesday with 800 cattle and 3,000 hogs finds a very slow market.

Cattle: Choice corn-fed beef \$5.40 to \$5.85, (extra choice up to \$6.15), fair to good \$5.00 to \$5.35. Choice hay-feds \$4.50 to \$5.00. Cows and heifers, corn-fed, \$3.50 to \$4.50, grass \$3.00 to \$4.00, canners \$1.50 to \$2.75. Stockers and feeders, steers, \$3.50 to \$4.25, heifers \$2.25 to \$2.75. Grass bulls \$2.00 to \$3.50. Veal \$4.50 to \$5.50.

Hogs: Coarse rough \$4.75 to \$5.00; medium \$5.05 to \$5.15; choice shippers \$5.20 to \$5.25.
