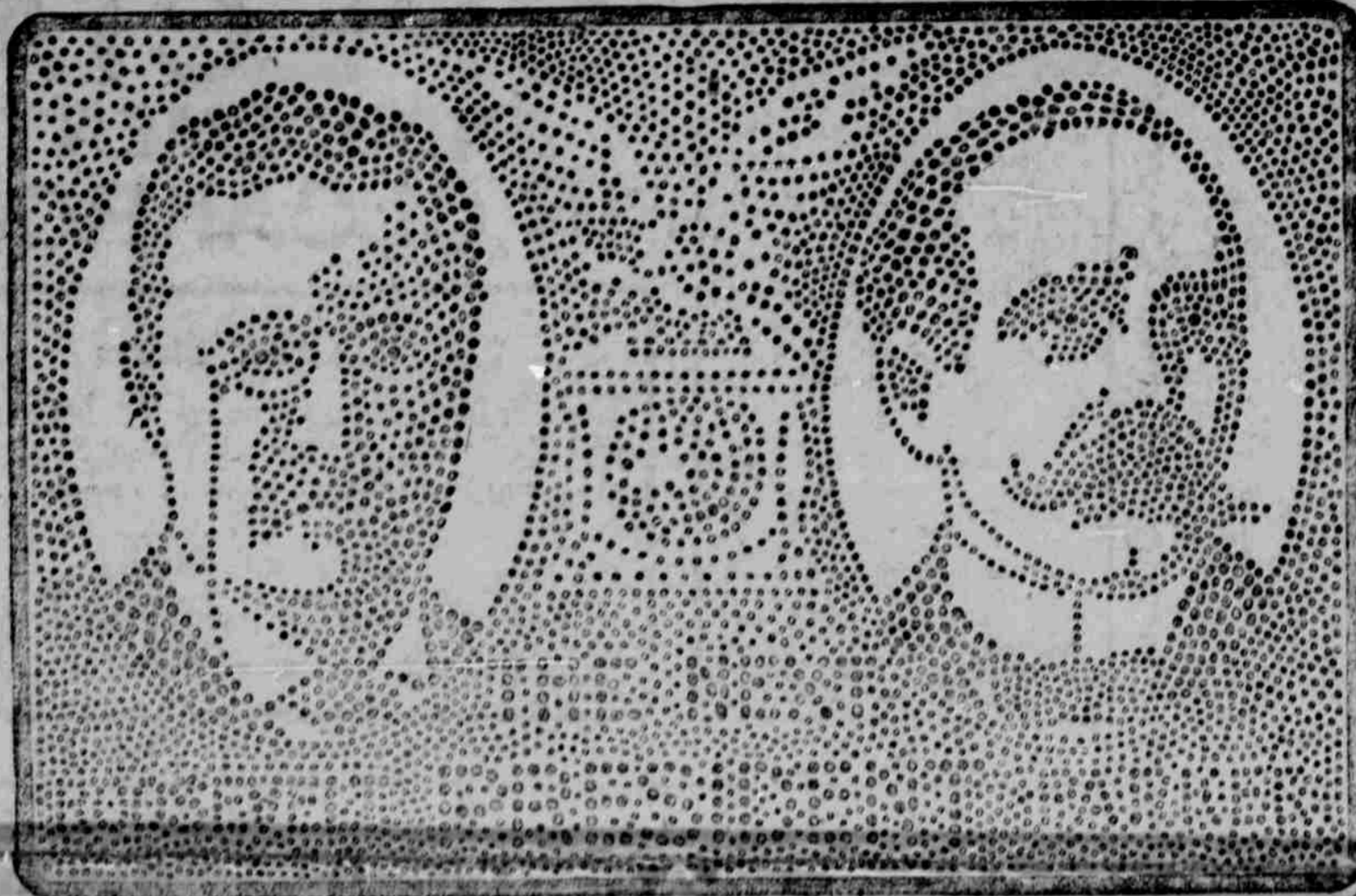

Each dot counts one, and no more, and only dots inside of black border are to be counted. Counts and remittances must be sent direct and not through agents.

A subscriber, new or old, to either the Daily or Saturday Star, will be entitled to two counts on the dots with every \$1.00 paid on account or in advance on subscription account.

New subscribers paying \$1.00 in advance on either Daily or Saturday Star, at the regular subscription price, will be entitled to two counts on the number of dots.

Old subscribers, those now taking The Star, by paying ALL ARREARAGES IN FULL TO DATE, will be entitled to two counts for each \$1.00 paid on account or in advance.

Each count will be numbered as opened in our Subscription Department, commencing with No. 1 each day, and will be considered received as numbered, and will be so registered. This is to prevent confusion as to time count is received, as all letters will be opened daily as received without preference, and the first opened will be numbered as the first received.

The contest will start on Saturday, October 1, with the first mail received, which is about 7:30 a. m. Counts received previous to that date will be held, and opened, numbered and recorded with those received then. This gives subscribers in all parts of the state an equal opportunity.

Positively no one connected with The Daily Star will be allowed to enter this contest.

Your name, address and counts must be written so plainly that there can be no mistake in reading it.

No counts will be recorded unless it is accompanied by payment of at least one dollar subscription to The Star.

Subscriptions paid prior to this contest or sent in separate envelope from the count will not entitle you to a registered count.

All orders and counts must be sent through the post-office or left at The Star Business Office in sealed envelopes.

Remit by postoffice order, express order or draft.

Two or more persons of the same family sending in counts may have the amount credited on one subscription.

You may send us a count as often as you wish, but One Dollar, to apply on Subscription, MUST accompany each blank.

Positively no estimates will be changed after letter reaches this office.

This contest closes Monday, November 7, at 8 o'clock p. m. Money received after that hour and date will be applied on subscriptions, but the "count" accompanying it will not be registered.

NOTE.—No one connected with The Star, not even the publishers, know the correct count of these dots, nor will they know until the contest closes.

AWARD OF PRIZES.

The First Prize will be awarded to the contestant submitting the first correct, or nearest correct, estimate on the number of dots in the chart. The Second Prize will be awarded to the one sending in the second correct or nearest correct estimate.

The remaining prizes will be awarded in their respective order to the contestants submitting the third, fourth, fifth, etc. best estimates, reckoning from the first answers received.

The 100th Prize will be awarded to the one sending in the LAST correct, or nearest correct, estimate.

The awards will be announced in the issue of November 12. The names, addresses and prizes of the several winners will be published in connection with the announcement of the awards.

There is no trick about the puzzle, it is absolutely a matter of skill and ingenuity.

The prizes are so arranged that the early replies cannot win all the large cash prizes.

It is not required that the exact number of dots be given. Should no one get the right number the prizes will be awarded to those whose estimates are the nearest correct. Read the Rules of the contest carefully.
