IMPORTANT NEWS OF THE WEEK

At the Peking railway station, as a train carrying one of the four missions ordered abroad to study foreign political methods was leaving, a bomb was exploded inside a private car, killing four minor officials and wounding over twenty other persons. The wounded include Prince Tsai Tohe, who heads the most important of the missions, and Wu Ting Fang, former minister to the United States, both of whom received slight injuries. The perpetrator of the outrage, who was in the car, was blown to pieces. The affair has created a profound sensation and causes apprehension regarding the safety of members of the court and leading officials of the government. The government officials and railways are strongly guarded.

George Poell, the brave fireman who save the life of Baby Ussuary at Powell, Neb., some time ago and lost a leg in doing so, was nominated for clerk of Hall county at Grand Island, Neb., Saturday by the democrats and populists. A dispatch from there says: It was a pathetic incident. Several eloquent addresses were made as to the heroic act of the man and when Mr. Poell was called for he merely bowed and said: "Gentlemen, I have not much to say, it kind of hurts," and his voice broke with emotion. His gratitude for the recognition was plainly manifest. There was scarcely a dry eye in the convention. He is an intelligent looking young man and is said to be fully qualified for the office.

Official dispatches received from Cienfuegos announced the killing of Congressman Enrique Villuendas, leader of the liberal party and the most able orator in the lower house and the chief of police of Cienfuegos during a conflict between the two political parties, the liberals and moderates. The government advices say the police had information that within the hotel in which Villuendas resided a quantity of arms had been deposited and they went to the hotel to investigate the matter. As the police ascended the stairs they were met by a party of liberals, who fired on them, killing Chief of Police Illance. The police returned the fire, killing Villuendas and wounding several others.

The liberals admit they were badly beaten in the elections held to elect members of election boards to serve at the general election to be held in Cuba on December 2, but claim they were outvoted because the moderates crowded the polling places and would not admit their workers, being aided in this, they claim by the police. Telegrams from the interior indicate a complete victory for the government throughout the island. As far as known the election passed off quietly, except at Placetas, where many shots were fired during an altercation between rival workers, but no one was killed, although there were several narrow escapes and a few were injured.

The Kansas City State bank, Wiley O. Cox, president, failed to open its doors, having gone into voluntary liquidation. The bank had loaned \$168,000 to the bank of Salmon & Salmon at Clinton, Mo., which failed last July, catching depositors for several hundred thousand dollars. The Kansas City State bank was organized in 1888 and had a capital of \$200,000. The last statement showed loans of \$4,000,000; deposits, \$4,750,000; surplus, \$14,000.

At West Point, Neb., the \$7,000 city hall refunding bonds have been sold to the Bankers Reserve Life Insur-

ance company of Omaha at a premium of \$112,700. The bid of this company was the highest received. The new bonds bear interest at 4 1/2 per cent, taking the place of bonds bearing 6 per cent, thus effecting an annual saving to the city of \$105 in interest.

Consul Mahm of Nottingham, Eng., reports that the surface cars in the latter city have carried during the past three years 80,000,000 passengers and that during that period only one man was killed. The lines are owned by the municipality.

Miss Alice Roosevelt and party attended the athletic sports of Japanese schoolboys at Seoul, Corea. The party was received by the Japanese educational committee. The entire party is now resting after the strenuous weeks spent in Japan, Manila and China. The visit is largely losing an official character and the party will spend some time picnicking and riding in the hills of Seoul and vicinity.

Prosecution of the railroads for violations of the Elkins law relating to rebates will follow the conviction of the four officials of Schwartzschild & Sulzberger for conspiring to receive rebates in the conduct of the packing business of the company. District Attorney Morrison made the announcement.

"Indian trust and heirship funds held on deposit to their credit are subject to taxation, as any other funds." Such is the gist of an important decision handed down by Judge Munger in the United States circuit court in the case of the United States, against the county of Thurston, state of Nebraska.
