WANT LIFE INSURANCE PROBED

Nebraska Agents Urge Investigation By the State

Omaha, Nebr., Dec. 3.—A vigorous demand for a state investigation of the life insurance companies chartered in the state of Nebraska was voiced by the Nebraska Life Underwriters' association in a series of resolutions, which declared the investigations in New York were for the good of policyholders, and that the limelight should be turned on western companies also.

It is asserted that neither set of companies, according to their sworn statements on file with the insurance department, expends from 34 to

48 per cent of its entire income on expenses of management, whereas the big New York companies now under investigation spend less than half as much.

The resolution demands "that life insurance companies chartered by the state of Nebraska should be investigated by a legislative committee or examined by an expert actuary in order that the citizens and policyholders of the state may know whether their policies are legally and properly safeguarded and their equities carefully secured, and thus make certain these companies have sufficient assets properly invested to cover all their liabilities, and also ascertain whether undue extravagance, nepotism, or other bad practices exist."

TO BAR FREE TRANSPORTATION

Pennsylvania Road Will Abolish Every Form of It

Philadelphia, Dec. 5.—In view of the general agitation on the subject of railroad rates and the abolition of all forms of rebates and concessions, it has been decided by the management of the Pennsylvania railroad that all forms of free transportation will be discontinued after the end of the present year.
