LIVESTOCK MARKET

(Special Market Letter from Nye & Buchanan Co., Live Stock Commission, South Omaha, Neb.)

South Omaha, Neb., Oct. 24.—The stormy weather is responsible for the light receipts of cattle so far this week, but we think it will also have the effect of starting many cattle to market sooner than owners intended as we understand the range in western Nebraska is covered with several inches of snow. The market can be quoted from steady to 20 cents higher than the close of last week, desirable killers of both cow and steer stock showing the most advance. Although feeders are some higher they will show enough extra shrink on account of the weather to more than cover the difference in price. We quote:
