Prepares Scottsboro Appeal for October 16

New York City—(CNA)—Wide-spread preparations are now going forward for the hearing before the Supreme Court on October 10, of the appeals of seven of the Scottsboro boys, the headquarters of the International Labor Defense announced last week.

These preparations include a national tag-day on October 1 and 2 for the Scottsboro defense fund; giant mass meetings on October 8, in almost every city of the United States; and the election, at the national convention of the International Labor Defense, on October 8 and 9 in Cleveland, of a delegation of Negro and white workers to present themselves in Washington on the day of the plea.

Walter H. Pollak, who has argued many cases before the Supreme Court, will be the petitioner for the boys. The brief has been prepared by Pollak and by George W. Chamlee of Chattanooga.

The nine Scottsboro boys were arrested March 25, 1931, at Paint Rock, Ala. They had been travelling on a freight train on which some other Negroes had had a fight with some white boys.
