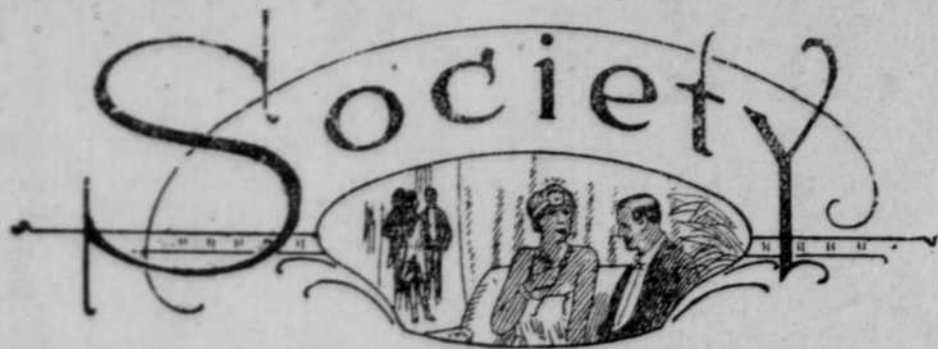

 For eight years previous to his election, President and Mrs. Olaya resided in Washington where he represented Colombia as its Minister to the United States.
