It has become the opinion of marty dispassionate and honest observers treasures committed to it by Christ, that the principal motive behind dis\_ proportionately heavy or unfair taxation of the utility industry, is to wreck the industry-and thus bring about a "public ownership" millenium in which the government will build and operate our power plants.
