## ROOSEVELT CONFERS WITH OFFICIALS ON INFLATIONARY PLANS

WANTS TO RAISE PRICES AS SUMMER 'BOOM' TURNS RAPIDLY DOWNWARD

WASHINGTON — Forced by the pressure of the impending collapse of his whole price-raising program, President Roosevelt yesterday met in conference with his closest financial advisors to consider methods of raising prices through more inflation.

The Roosevelt industrial "boom" of the summer months is fast turning into an intensified industrial crisis. Production has turned sharply downward, while prices, though still way above the March levels, are beginning to show signs of marked weakness, for lack of any real retail buying by the workers, whose purchasing power has been cut by the Roosevelt
