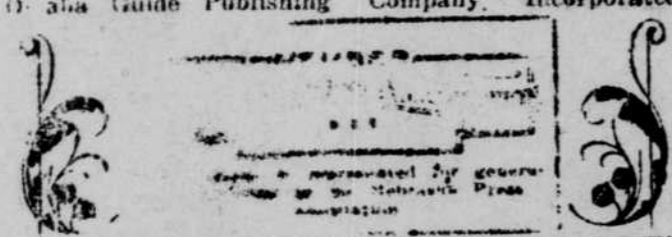

EDITORIAL

REMOVE THE JUDICIARY FROM POLITICS

The trend of the time nationally and locally is an utter and complete removal of the judiciary from possible or remote control of unscrupulous politicians.

It is an undeniable fact that judges, knowing that their term either shall expire, and they must run for reelection, naturally must be somewhat of a politician, keeping their ear forever on the ground ever tempted to show favor to politicians.

This end may be accomplished by entrenching judges in their offices and giving to them the security necessary to enable them to fulfill their office without any feeling of necessity of currying favor of any person or group of persons.

It may be argued that the governor would have no control over these men after they were confirmed, and too, his term of office is short in comparison to the term of the judges.

We submit this to the candidates to the legislature, and ask that the "Removal of the Judiciary from Politics," be incorporated as a plank in their platform, and that they will submit such legislation as is necessary to bring about this end.

WHERRY CHALLENGE

SIMMONS' RECORD

Kenneth S. Wherry, Republican candidate for the United States Senate in a speech before the Douglas County Voters League, Tuesday evening said, "That former Congressman Simmons ten year record in the National Congress does not warrant his asking the people of Nebraska to represent them in the Senate."

His chief supporter and backer in this campaign, Samuel R. McKelvie was given a place on the board at an enormous salary. The farmers of Nebraska and the people of the United States are now paying that salary and the debt incurred because of the provisions of this most socialistic and impractical experiment, which, I am informed has been admitted by Mr. McKelvie as a failure.

Former State Senator Wherry continued his charges against the Congressman that he helped set up the Government in the banking business and one of the first acts was to loan the Charles Dawes Bank of Chicago ninety million dollars, approximately one-third hundredth of our present national indebtedness.

How can one come to the people of Nebraska, asking election on a platform "Keep the Government out of business," with a record as socialistic as that?

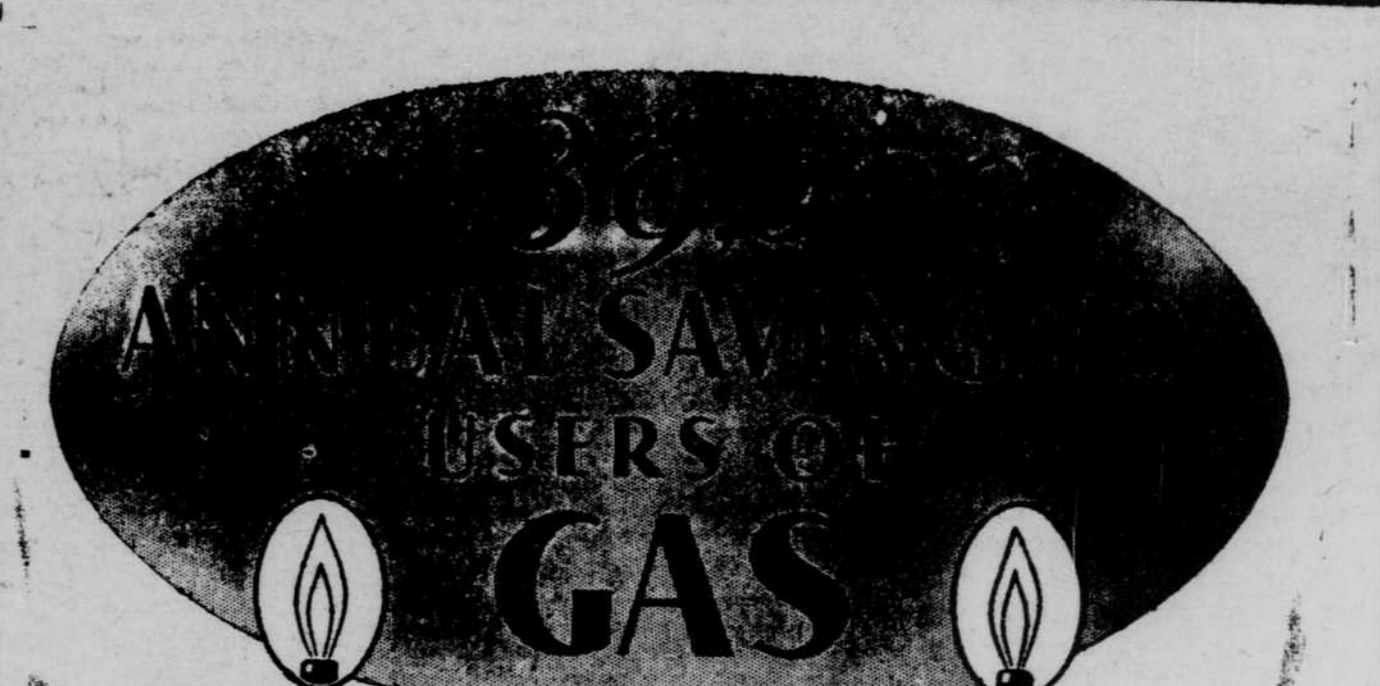

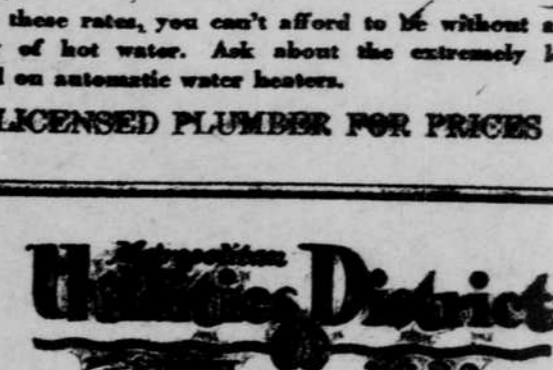
